

New Jersey is preparing for a flu pandemic.

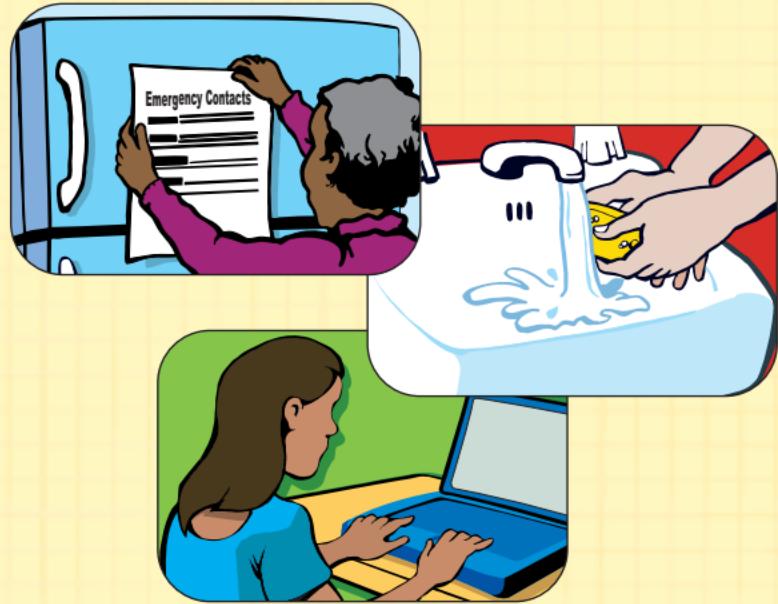
Are you?
