# BOROUGH OF ELMWOOD PARK ORDINANCE #15-09

BOND ORDINANCE TO APPROPRIATE AN ADDITIONAL SUM OF \$96,200 FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF ADA HANDICAPPED ACCESS CURB RAMPS AT MARKET STREET AND MIDLAND AVENUE IN, BY AND FOR THE BOROUGH OF ELMWOOD PARK, IN THE COUNTY OF BERGEN, NEW JERSEY, TO MAKE A DOWN PAYMENT, TO AUTHORIZE THE ISSUANCE OF BONDS TO FINANCE SUCH ADDITIONAL APPROPRIATION AND TO PROVIDE FOR THE ISSUANCE OF BOND ANTICIPATION NOTES IN ANTICIPATION OF THE ISSUANCE OF SUCH BONDS.

WHEREAS, the Borough Council of the Borough of Elmwood Park has heretofore authorized the construction of ADA handicapped access curb ramps at Market Street and Midland Avenue in, by and for said Borough and appropriated the sum of \$250,000 therefor pursuant to ordinance no. 13-27 adopted by the Borough Council of said Borough on November 7, 2013; and

WHEREAS, the Borough Council now finds and determines that the additional sum of \$96,200 is required for such improvement, NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED by the Borough Council of the Borough of Elmwood Park, in the County of Bergen, New Jersey (the "Borough"), as follows:

Section 1. The additional sum of \$96,200 is hereby appropriated to the payment of the cost of the improvement authorized by ordinance no. 13-27 adopted by the Borough Council of the Borough on November 7, 2013 (the "Prior Ordinance"). Said additional appropriation shall be met from the down payment appropriated and from the proceeds of the sale of the bonds authorized by this ordinance. It is anticipated that a grant in the amount of \$96,200 shall be received by the Borough from the County of Bergen to finance the additional cost of the improvement. Said grant funds shall be applied as set forth in Section 9 hereof. Said improvement has been and shall be made as a general improvement and no part of the cost thereof has been nor shall be assessed against property specially benefited.

Section 2. It is hereby determined and stated that (1) the making of such improvement (hereinafter referred to as "purpose") is not a current expense of said Borough, and (2) it is necessary to

finance said purpose by the issuance of obligations of said Borough pursuant to the Local Bond Law (Chapter 2 of Title 40A of the New Jersey Statutes Annotated, as amended; the "Local Bond Law"), and (3) the estimated cost of said purpose authorized by the Prior Ordinance is \$346,200, including the sum of \$250,000 appropriated by the Prior Ordinance and the \$96,200 appropriated by this ordinance, and (4) \$16,600 of said sum is to be provided by the down payment, including the \$12,000 appropriated by the Prior Ordinance and the \$4,600 hereinafter appropriated to finance said purpose, and (5) estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes necessary to be issued for said purpose is \$329,600, including the \$238,000 authorized by the Prior Ordinance and the \$91,600 hereinafter authorized, and (6) the cost of such purpose includes the aggregate amount of \$50,000, including the sum of \$30,000 stated in the Prior Ordinance and the sum of \$20,000 hereby stated, which is estimated to be necessary to finance the cost of such purpose, including architect's fees, accounting, engineering and inspection costs, legal expenses and other expenses, including interest on such obligations to the extent permitted by Section 20 of the Local Bond Law.

Section 3. It is hereby determined and stated that moneys exceeding \$4,600, appropriated for down payments on capital improvements or for the capital improvement fund in budgets heretofore adopted for said Borough, are now available to finance said purpose. The sum of \$4,600 is hereby appropriated from such moneys to the payment of the cost of said purpose.

Section 4. To finance said purpose, bonds of said Borough of an aggregate principal amount not exceeding \$91,600 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to the Local Bond Law. Said bonds shall bear interest at a rate per annum as may be hereafter determined within the limitations prescribed by law. All matters with respect to said bonds not determined by this ordinance shall be determined by resolutions to be hereafter adopted.

Section 5. To finance said purpose, bond anticipation notes of said Borough of an aggregate principal amount not exceeding \$91,600 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to the Local Bond Law in anticipation of the issuance of said bonds. In the event that bonds are issued pursuant to this ordinance, the aggregate amount of notes hereby authorized to be issued shall be reduced by an amount equal to the principal amount of the bonds so issued. If the aggregate amount of outstanding bonds and notes issued pursuant to this ordinance shall at any time exceed the sum first mentioned in this section, the moneys raised by the issuance of said bonds shall, to not less than the amount of such excess, be applied to the payment of such notes then outstanding.

Section 6. Each bond anticipation note issued pursuant to this ordinance shall be dated on or about the date of its issuance and shall be payable not more than one year from its date, shall bear interest at a rate per annum as may be hereafter determined within the limitations prescribed by law and may be renewed from time to time pursuant to and within limitations prescribed by the Local Bond Law. Each of said notes shall be signed by the Mayor and by a financial officer and shall be under the seal of said Borough and attested by the Borough Clerk or Deputy Borough Clerk. Said officers are hereby authorized to execute said notes in such form as they may adopt in conformity with law. The power to determine any matters with respect to said notes not determined by this ordinance and also the power to sell said notes, is hereby delegated to the Chief Financial Officer who is hereby authorized to sell said notes either at one time or from time to time in the manner provided by law.

Section 7. It is hereby determined and declared that the period of usefulness of said purpose, according to its reasonable life, is a period of ten years computed from the date of said bonds.

Section 8. It is hereby determined and stated that the Supplemental Debt Statement required by the Local Bond Law has been duly made and filed in the office of the Borough Clerk of said

Borough, and that such statement so filed shows that the gross debt of said Borough, as defined in Section 43 of the Local Bond Law, is increased by this ordinance by \$91,600 and that the issuance of the bonds and notes authorized by this ordinance will be within all debt limitations prescribed by the Local Bond Law.

Section 9. Any funds received from private parties, the County of Bergen, the State of New Jersey or any of their agencies or any funds received from the United States of America or any of its agencies in aid of such purpose, shall be applied to the payment of the cost of such purpose, or, if bond anticipation notes have been issued, to the payment of the bond anticipation notes, and the amount of bonds authorized for such purpose shall be reduced accordingly.

Section 10. The Borough intends to issue the bonds or notes to finance the cost of the improvement authorized by the Prior Ordinance and described herein. If the Borough incurs such costs prior to the issuance of the bonds or notes, the Borough hereby states its reasonable expectation to reimburse itself for such expenditures with the proceeds of such bonds or notes in the maximum principal amount of bonds or notes authorized by this bond ordinance.

Section 11. The full faith and credit of the Borough are hereby pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and the interest on the obligations authorized by this ordinance. Said obligations shall be direct, unlimited and general obligations of the Borough, and the Borough shall levy ad valorem taxes upon all the taxable real property within the Borough for the payment of the principal of and interest on such bonds and notes, without limitation as to rate or amount.

Section 12. The capital budget is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency therewith and the resolutions promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing full detail of the amended capital budget and capital program as approved by the Director, Division of Local

Government Services, is on file with the Borough Clerk and is available for public inspection.

Section 13. This ordinance shall take effect twenty days after the first publication thereof after final passage.

### ORDINANCE NO. #15-11

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING AND SUPPLEMENTING CHAPTER: 14-1.10 (f), ENTITLED FIRE PREVENTION TECHNICAL AMENDMENTS OF THE BOROUGH OF ELMWOOD PARK.

WHEREAS, CHAPTER 14-1.10(f) of the Code of the Borough of Elmwood Park provides for Access to Fire Hydrants; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council maintain that it is in the best interest of the Borough residents to ensure that the Fire Hydrants located in the municipality are maintained clear of snow and ice.

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED** by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Elmwood Park, County of Bergen and State of New Jersey as follows:

**SECTION 1:** Chapter **14-1.10(f)** shall be deleted and replace with the following:

f. Access to Fire Hydrants. To insure access to fire hydrants in the Borough of Elmwood Park for the safety and welfare of the public, a clear area of five (5) feet must be maintained in all directions from the fire hydrant as well as meeting the road side parking requirements.

The owner or lessee of any property within five (5) feet of a fire hydrant shall be responsible to see that a five (5) foot clear space is provided in all directions from the fire hydrant. The requirements of this section shall be completed by the responsible party not later than twenty-four (24) hours after any natural obstruction such as snow shall prevent access to the fire hydrant and within twelve (12) hours of any other type of obstruction.

Upon the failure of any person in maintaining the open space for all fire hydrants in accordance with this section, shall be deemed a violation of the Fire Safety Code, shall be required to appear in the Borough of Elmwood Park Municipal Court and shall be fined up to five hundred dollars (\$500) at the discretion of the Judge of the Borough of Elmwood Park

The Elmwood Park Police Department and the Elmwood Park Fire Prevention Bureau shall be responsible for the strict enforcement of the aforementioned Access to Fire Hydrants.

### **SECTION 2:** Repealer

All Ordinances of the Borough of Elmwood Park to the extent that same are not inconsistent with this Ordinance shall remain in full force and effect until modified or repealed pursuant to law. All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed as to such inconsistencies.

#### **SECTION 3:** Invalid Provisions

If any section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance is for any reason held to be unconstitutional or invalid, such decision shall not affect the remaining portions of this Ordinance.

# CALENDAR YEAR 2015 ORDINANCE TO EXCEED THE MUNICIPAL BUDGET APPROPRIATION LIMITS AND TO ESTABLISH A CAP BANK (N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.14)

WHEREAS, the Local Government Cap Law, N.J.S. 40A: 4-45.1 et seq., provides that in the preparation of its annual budget, a municipality shall limit any increase in said budget up to 1.5% unless authorized by ordinance to increase it to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, subject to certain exceptions; and

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.15 a provides that a municipality may, when authorized by ordinance, appropriate the difference between the amount of its actual final appropriation and the 3.5% percentage rate as an exception to its final appropriations in either of the next two succeeding years; and

WHEREAS, the Governing Body of the Borough of Elmwood Park in the County of Bergen finds it advisable and necessary to increase its CY 2015 budget by up to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, in the interest of promoting the health, safety and welfare of the citizens; and

WHEREAS, the Governing Body hereby determines that a 2.0 % increase in the budget for said year, amounting to \$352,757 in excess of the increase in final appropriations otherwise permitted by the Local Government Cap Law, is advisable and necessary; and

WHEREAS the Governing Body hereby determines that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED, by the Governing Body of the Borough of Elmwood Park, in the County of Bergen, a majority of the full authorized membership of this governing body affirmatively concurring, that, in the CY 2015 budget year, the final appropriations of the Borough of Elmwood Park shall, in accordance with this ordinance and N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.14, be increased by 2.0 %, amounting to \$352,757 and that the CY 2015 municipal budget for the Borough of Elmwood Park be approved and adopted in accordance with this ordinance; and

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that any that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years; and

**BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED**, that a certified copy of this ordinance as introduced be filed with the Director of the Division of Local Government Services within 5 days of introduction; and

**BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED**, that a certified copy of this ordinance upon adoption, with the recorded vote included thereon, be filed with said Director within 5 days after such adoption.

Council President Dombrowski hopes this ordinance will make the process easier for businesses to come to Elmwood Park. Mayor Mola stated the previous ordinance enable a large majority of businesses on Market Street to bypass the Planning Board. He further stated this ordinance pertains to businesses that are over 10,000 square feet. Mayor Mola listed the following reasons against the ordinance. The public will no longer be aware of applicants interested in coming into Elmwood Park. He stated the transparency of the applications will no longer be available so that the residents of Elmwood Park can inquire about an incoming business. He stated the current ordinance has been in effect for over 50 years. He further stated upon approval of this ordinance, there will no longer be a public record such as audio or minutes regarding the approval of a business. He stated an application will no longer be reviewed by the members of the Planning Board, the Engineer and the Planning Board Attorney, instead it would be reviewed and approved by only the Zoning Officer. He further discussed work load of the Zoning Official and the possibility of the Officer changing in the future. He stated that he feels this ordinance circumvents the requirements by State law regarding Limited Liability Corporations requiring an attorney. Mayor Mola read a comment made at a Planning Board meeting by the Planning Board Attorney. He stated that some properties must go before the Planning Board to obtain a resolution. Mayor Mola then requested the ordinance be tabled for further discussion. Councilman Caramagna discussed the cost incurred by small businesses for an attorney. He further stated that changes need to be made to the Planning Board.

#### **ORDINANCE 15-08**

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND SECTIONS 34-9, C.2(b) 34-58.3 OF CHAPTER XXXIV OF THE CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF ELMWOOD PARK ENTITLED "ZONING AND SITE PLAN REVIEW."

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Elmwood Park, County of Bergen, and State of New Jersey as follows:

# **SECTION 1:**

- A. Chapter 34-9, C.2(b) shall be deleted.
- B. Chapter 34-58.3 shall be amended as follows:

# 34-58.3 Certificate of Continuing Occupancy for Commercial, Industrial and Residential Premises.

a. No person shall occupy or use any portion of a commercial, industrial or residential building after such building or portion thereof has been vacated or sold, or for which there has been a change in use or a change in occupancy, until the owner/landlord shall have applied for and secured a Certificate of Continuing Occupancy from the Zoning Enforcement Officer of the Borough of Elmwood Park.

With respect to any change in occupancy/ownership in any nonresidential district the Zoning Officer shall have the discretion to determine whether a full review and approval by the Planning Board should be made prior to the issuance of a Continuing Certificate of Occupancy. At the discretion of the Zoning Officer continuing uses in nonresidential districts in will be directed to the Planning Board for determination of adequacy in parking and conformance with the Zoning Ordinances of Elmwood Park and any land use resolutions in effect. The Zoning Enforcement Officer's review shall verify:

- 1. The type of business of the new occupant is a permitted use.
- 2. The number of employees of the new occupant shall be equal to or less than the past one.
- 3. The number of parking spaces required by the new occupant shall be equal to or less than the past one.
  - 4. The nature of the interior renovations (i.e., substantial or minor) of the new occupant.
  - 5. New or relocated office, medical and/or retail use in a building.

If the Zoning Enforcement Officer determines that based upon the above factors Planning Board review and approval is not required, the Zoning Enforcement Officer shall then have the authority to issue to the owner/tenant the appropriate Continuing Certificate of Occupancy.

If the Zoning Enforcement Officer determines that based upon the above factors Planning Board review and approval is required, the matter shall then be referred to the Planning Board. The Planning Board shall review the application and impose the same requirements the Board applies in the issuance of a Continuing Certificate of Occupancy.

b. Upon receipt by the Enforcement Officer of an application for a Certificate of Continuing Occupancy and payment of the requisite fee, the Enforcement Officer or person designated by him shall conduct an inspection of the premises in question to insure compliance with applicable building, health,

safety and fire codes, regulations, ordinances and statutes of the Borough of Elmwood Park and State of New Jersey.

- c. The Enforcement Officer shall issue a Certificate of Continuing Occupancy upon his inspection and satisfaction that no violation of the aforementioned codes, regulations, ordinances and statutes exist.
- d. If violations are found to exist, there shall be no new occupancy or use of the premises until compliance with this subsection has been obtained. If compliance is not obtained within a reasonable time after inspection and notice, the Enforcement Officer is authorized to take appropriate legal action.
- e. The Enforcement Officer shall provide a form to be completed by each applicant. One hundred (\$100.00) dollars shall be paid for residential single-family dwellings. A fee of two hundred seventy-five (\$275.00) dollars shall be paid for commercial multi-family or industrial properties. The Enforcement Officer may waive the inspection and the above fee if an inspection of the same premises has been made within sixty (60) days, and there has been no physical change to the property.

#### **COMMITTEE REPORTS**

Councilman Martino reported on the upcoming Opening Day of Baseball and the next Homeowner's Meeting. He spoke about National Autism Day and discussed the challenges some families experience.

Councilman Colletti reported that he heard that the County is seeking to charge the Borough for the use of Gilbert Avenue field. He stated that there has never been a charge and we assume responsibility for taking care of the fields. The Mayor stated that he spoke to the County and there will be no fee for the spring season. Councilman Colletti stated that he feels charging us is essentially a tax on the town.

Councilman Caramagna wished everyone a Happy Easter. He discussed National Autism Day and his nephew who has autism. He further stated that the Planning Board will be reviewing the plans for the Elmwood Park School District fields next Wednesday. The Councilman discussed the zero tax increase and the efforts by the Council to save \$125,000 by using the County for Heath Department services.

Council President Dombrowski discussed Autism Awareness. He announced the Chamber of Commerce holding a bowling event at Parkway Lanes. He wished everyone a Happy Passover and a Happy Easter. He encouraged residents to support the Fire Department Boot Drive. The Councilman further addressed the fact that the County is not charging for the fields. The discussion of the fee came up due to a County ordinance calling for a fee for groups to use County fields. He spoke to the Deputy Parks Director and there will be no fee, as we line and maintain the field.

Councilman Vuoncino welcomes our newest Police Officer. He discussed the NJ SEM electric bid. He wished everyone a Happy Passover and a Happy Easter.

Mayor Mola wished everyone a Happy Passover and a Happy Easter. He thanked Congressman Pascrell for his efforts at the Midland Avenue railroad crossing. He discussed commuters needing to be alert at that location. The Mayor discussed the Planning Board hearing concerning the football field improvements at the high school. He attended a meeting with Mr. Kazmark with the realtors where other Mayors discussed challenges in their communities when it comes to drugs. The 100<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Committee meeting will be held next week.

### **PUBLIC HEARING**

Jeffery Frietag, Hillman Drive inquired whether the Planning Board members have received the football field plans from the Board of Education. He further discussed fire hydrants and snow removal on his street. He wished everyone a happy holiday.

Steve Conte, Market Street asked about the fire hydrant ordinance and how it will affect handicapped or elderly residents. He inquired about the sewer main issue at the intersection of Market Street and Boulevard and who is responsible for the damage at St. Leo's Church. He asked about the staffing levels and arrests made by the Police Department. He discussed drug arrests and issues on the Route 4 corridor. He discussed taxes and the zero based budget. Discussion ensued as to Police Dispatchers. Mr. Conte discussed the zoning ordinance voted upon tonight and the need to have shared parking ordinance introduced. He discussed examples of how a shared parking ordinance would be beneficial. Discussion regarding parking in the business district ensued. Mr. Conte asked about whether any tickets were issued for unplowed sidewalks. He asked about developers giving back and helping the town. He mentioned last week's meeting and the video being cut off prior to the public comment section. He asked what happened. Mr. Kazmark responded that once his office was advised, he took corrective steps to make sure the full video was posted on the website. Mr. Conte again discussed the need for a shared parking ordinance.

Dan Golabek, Godwin Avenue asked about the fine in the previous fire hydrant ordinance. Mr. Kazmark advised that there was no enforcement authority in the original ordinance. Discussion ensued as to why the ordinance was brought to the attention of the Mayor and Council. Mr. Golabek asked about the residents being made aware of the ordinance. He asked about the Market Street pump station repairs. He further asked about the surplus in the water budget and how those funds are used.

James Damico, Willow Street, asked the Mayor and Council to look into this fire hydrant ordinance again. He expressed concern about hydrants which are placed on the corners. Mr. Kazmark explained that there are residents who are chronically not removing snow from the hydrant in front of their homes. This is a tool for when we have a consistent problem. Mr. Damico asked about the 24 hour requirement to clear the hydrant.

A motion was made by Council President Dombrowski and seconded by Councilman Martino to adjourn. Motion carried unanimously.
