BOROUGH OF ELMWOOD PARK

ORDINANCE # 15-13

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING AND SUPPLEMENTING CHAPTER XXXIV OF THE CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF ELMWOOD PARK ENTITLED "ZONING AND SITE PLAN REVIEW".

This zoning amendment would replace in its entirety the C-L Local Commercial Zone with a new N-C Neighborhood Commercial Zone; with the exception of the C.L. District fronting on Broadway between East 53rd Street and East 55th Street.

STATEMENT OF PURPOSE

The purpose of the new N-C Neighborhood Commercial Zone is to provide for Use, Lot and Bulk Regulations which will encourage private Reinvestment and Renewal along the Market Street Commercial Area. The guiding principles and objectives of this Zone are as follows:

- 1. Provide for a coordinated streetscape design in accordance with the Counties and Boroughs current street improvement program.
- 2. Provide for public open spaces and Municipal facilities.
- 3. Establish realistic/implementable minimum lot area requirements.
- 4. Provide for a contemporary array of balanced mix uses which will strengthen the area and serve the community's needs.
- 5. Provide development bonus incentives which will create better scaled, more cost effective development patterns.
- 6. Provide for pedestrian friendly development, which is safely accessible from adjoining residential neighborhoods.
- 7. Provide for wider sidewalks and streetscape design improvements consistent with Bergen County improvement criteria.

PROPOSED REVISIONS

- 1. Revise Article V Districts and Zoning Map, Section 34-5 Establishment of Districts, and Subsection 34-5.1 to add as a new District the N.C. Neighborhood Commercial District.
- 2. Revise Article V Districts and Zoning Map, Section 34-5 Establishment of Districts, and Section 34-5.2 Zoning District Map to add the N.C. Neighborhood Commercial District to all current C.L. Local Commercial District locations with the exception of the C.L. Local Commercial District located on the south side of Broadway between East 53rd street and East 54th Street.
- 3. Amend ARTICLE VI Use Regulations, Section 34-6 District Land Use Regulations, Section 34-7 Table of Use Regulations, and subsections 34-7.2, 34-7.3 and 34-7.4, to add as a new district the N.C. Neighborhood Commercial District specifying and listing all uses as currently permitted in the C.L.Local Commercial District..
- 4. Revise Article VIII Bulk Requirements, Section 34-16 District Lot and Bulk Regulations, Section 34-17 Table of Lot and Bulk Regulations, to add the following N.C. Neighborhood Commercial District Lot and Bulk Regulations:

- 5. Revise Article IX Supplementary Regulations, Section 34-30 Signs, and Section 34-30.2 Signs Permitted in the C-L and CO Districts by adding reference to the new N.C. Neighborhood Commercial District. Revise Article IX Supplementary Regulations, Section 34-31 Conditional Uses, and Section 34-31.12 Arcade Regulations, and Sections 34-31.12b, 34-31.12b1 by adding reference to the new N.C. Neighborhood Commercial District.
- 6. Revise Article IX Supplementary Regulations, Section 34-31 Conditional Uses to add a new Section 34-31.13 as follows:

34-31.13. N-C Neighborhood Commercial District Parking Expansion

Additional accessory parking adjacent to the N-C Neighborhood Commercial District is hereby permitted as a conditional use in the R-9 and R-18 Residential District subject to the following requirements:

- 1. Said additional parking shall be limited to a maximum depth of 50 feet from the boundary of the adjacent N.C. Neighborhood Commercial District; or equal to the existing width or depth of the adjacent residentially zoned lot.
- 2. No building or structures shall be permitted within the 50 foot parking area with the exception of fencing.
- 3. A buffer no less than 20 feet in width shall be established at the residential edge between the parking area and adjacent residential uses.
- 4. Uses not expressly permitted by this Ordinance are expressly prohibited.
- 5. All building entrances and exits shall be at grade level.
- 6. Driveway access shall be prohibited from any Residential Zone.
- 7. Any new construction shall meet the Borough Parking requirements of this Ordinance.

BOROUGH OF ELMWOOD PARK ORDINANCE # 15-18

BOND ORDINANCE TO AUTHORIZE THE REMOUNTING OF TWO AMBULANCES ONTO NEW CHASSIS IN, BY AND FOR THE BOROUGH OF ELMWOOD PARK, IN THE COUNTY OF BERGEN, NEW JERSEY, TO APPROPRIATE THE SUM OF \$220,000 TO PAY THE COST THEREOF, TO MAKE A DOWN PAYMENT, TO AUTHORIZE THE ISSUANCE OF BONDS TO FINANCE SUCH APPROPRIATION AND TO PROVIDE FOR THE ISSUANCE OF BOND ANTICIPATION NOTES IN ANTICIPATION OF THE ISSUANCE OF SUCH BONDS.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Borough Council of the Borough of Elmwood Park, in the County of Bergen, New Jersey, as follows:

Section 1. The Borough of Elmwood Park, in the County of Bergen, New Jersey (the "Borough") is hereby authorized to undertake the remounting of two ambulances onto new chassis, which may reasonably be expected to extend for at least five years the period of usefulness thereof, for the use of the Volunteer Ambulance Corps in, by and for said Borough. Said improvements shall include all work, materials and appurtenances necessary and suitable therefor.

Section 2. The sum of \$220,000 is hereby appropriated to the payment of the cost of making the improvements described in Section 1 hereof (hereinafter referred to as "purpose"). Said appropriation shall be met from the proceeds of the sale of the bonds authorized and the down payment appropriated by this ordinance. Said improvements shall be made as general improvements and no part of the cost thereof shall be assessed against property specially benefited.

Section 3. It is hereby determined and stated that (1) the making of such improvements is not a current expense of said Borough, and (2) it is necessary to finance said purpose by the issuance of obligations of said Borough pursuant to the Local Bond Law (Chapter 2 of Title 40A of the New Jersey Statutes Annotated, as amended; the "Local Bond Law"), and (3) the estimated cost of said purpose is \$220,000, and (4) \$11,000 of said sum is to be provided by the down payment hereinafter appropriated to finance said purpose, and (5) the estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes necessary to be issued for said purpose is \$209,000, and (6) the cost of such purpose, as hereinbefore stated, includes the aggregate amount of \$5,000 which is estimated to be necessary to finance the cost of such purpose, including architect's fees,

accounting, engineering and inspection costs, legal expenses and other expenses, including interest on such obligations to the extent permitted by Section 20 of the Local Bond Law.

Section 4. It is hereby determined and stated that moneys exceeding \$11,000, appropriated for down payments on capital improvements or for the capital improvement fund in budgets heretofore adopted for said Borough, are now available to finance said purpose. The sum of \$11,000 is hereby appropriated from such moneys to the payment of the cost of said purpose.

Section 5. To finance said purpose, bonds of said Borough of an aggregate principal amount not exceeding \$209,000 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to the Local Bond Law. Said bonds shall bear interest at a rate per annum as may be hereafter determined within the limitations prescribed by law. All matters with respect to said bonds not determined by this ordinance shall be determined by resolutions to be hereafter adopted.

Section 6. To finance said purpose, bond anticipation notes of said Borough of an aggregate principal amount not exceeding \$209,000 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to the Local Bond Law in anticipation of the issuance of said bonds. In the event that bonds are issued pursuant to this ordinance, the aggregate amount of notes hereby authorized to be issued shall be reduced by an amount equal to the principal amount of the bonds so issued. If the aggregate amount of outstanding bonds and notes issued pursuant to this ordinance shall at any time exceed the sum first mentioned in this section, the moneys raised by the issuance of said bonds shall, to not less than the amount of such excess, be applied to the payment of such notes then outstanding.

Section 7. Each bond anticipation note issued pursuant to this ordinance shall be dated on or about the date of its issuance and shall be payable not more than one year from its date, shall bear interest at a rate per annum as may be hereafter determined within the limitations prescribed by law and may be renewed from time to time pursuant to and within limitations prescribed by the Local Bond Law. Each of said notes shall be signed by the Mayor and by a financial officer and shall be under the seal of said Borough and attested by the Borough Clerk or Deputy Borough Clerk. Said officers are hereby authorized to execute said notes and to issue said notes in such form as they may adopt in conformity with law. The power to determine any matters with respect to said notes not determined by this ordinance and also the power to sell

said notes, is hereby delegated to the Chief Financial Officer, who is hereby authorized to sell said notes either at one time or from time to time in the manner provided by law.

Section 8. It is hereby determined and declared that the period of usefulness of said purpose, according to its reasonable life, is a period of five years computed from the date of said bonds.

Section 9. It is hereby determined and stated that the Supplemental Debt Statement required by the Local Bond Law has been duly made and filed in the office of the Borough Clerk of said Borough, and that such statement so filed shows that the gross debt of said Borough, as defined in Section 43 of the Local Bond Law, is increased by this ordinance by \$209,000 and that the issuance of the bonds and notes authorized by this ordinance will be within all debt limitations prescribed by said Local Bond Law.

Section 10. Any funds received from private parties, the County of Bergen, the State of New Jersey or any of their agencies or any funds received from the United States of America or any of its agencies in aid of such purpose, shall be applied to the payment of the cost of such purpose, or, if bond anticipation notes have been issued, to the payment of the bond anticipation notes, and the amount of bonds authorized for such purpose shall be reduced accordingly.

Section 11. The capital budget is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency therewith and the resolutions promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing full detail of the amended capital budget and capital program as approved by the Director, Division of Local Government Services, is on file with the Borough Clerk and is available for public inspection.

Section 12. The Borough intends to issue the bonds or notes to finance the cost of the improvements described in Section 1 of this bond ordinance. If the Borough incurs such costs prior to the issuance of the bonds or notes, the Borough hereby states its reasonable expectation to reimburse itself for such expenditures with the proceeds of such bonds or notes in the maximum principal amount of bonds or notes authorized by this bond ordinance.

Section 13. The full faith and credit of the Borough are hereby pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and the interest on the obligations authorized by this ordinance. Said obligations shall be direct, unlimited and general obligations of the Borough, and the Borough shall levy <u>ad valorem</u> taxes upon all the taxable real property within the

Borough for the payment of the principal of and interest on such bonds and notes, without limitation as to rate or amount.

Section 14. This ordinance shall take effect twenty days after the first publication thereof after final passage.

Council President Dombrowski congratulated all the Elmwood Park graduates. He reported on Community Day and our first bike day.

PUBLIC HEARING

Rick Rodriguez, North Midland Avenue, Saddle Brook discussed the Passaic River and his goal in trying to help the river. He discussed making the Passaic River a "destination." He discussed kayaking in the river and trying to change the impression people have of the river. Mr. Rodriguez spoke about working with the Passaic Valley Sewer Commission. He discussed recently being interviewed on the radio about the river and the opportunities for sporting events and activities on the river. Mr. Rodriguez talked about the potential for the river and other cleanup efforts he has undertaken. Councilman Colletti applauded Mr. Rodriguez's efforts. The Councilman further discussed how the river is getting cleaner and the history of the marina. Mr. Rodriguez discussed various community efforts which he would like to see planned. Council President Dombrowski thanked him for his efforts with the river and encouraged him to meet with our Recreation Director and the Recreation Advisory Board to discuss his ideas.

Jeff Marston, Elizabeth Avenue, stated he spoke to the Mayor's Office regarding parking signs. He also asked about the hours in which the parks are open. Council President Dombrowski stated the parks are open from dawn to dusk. He discussed the jungle gym, lights and swing at the park and advised the Mayor's Office, but nothing has been done. He spoke about the staffing at the new after school program to be operated by the Recreation Department. He discussed staffing and Councilman Pettigano responded as to how the staffing will be addressed for the program. Mr. Marston expressed some concern about the counselors at the summer camp being on their cell phones and not being attentive to the children. Councilman Pettigano advised him to let the Director know if he has concerns. Mr. Marston discussed concerns about supervisors. Mr. Kazmark discussed how any concerns should be handled. He also addressed the after school program and the reputation of the summer program. Mr. Marston discussed the current school based after school program. He further stated that the meeting with the Superintendent and the Recreation Director was hostile. Councilman Pettigano discussed the change and why the Borough is taking the program back. Discussion ensued as to the school being able to staff the program. Mr. Kazmark discussed his and Mr. Puglisi's discussion and their attempt to host the program at the Recreation Center. Mr. Martson asked about staffing and whether the school district employees would be hired by the town. He further discussed the Recreation Department's "no-tolerance" policy. Council President Dombrowski explained why the Borough sets the policies we have in place. Mr. Martson asked about the times lines for registration. Council President Dombrowski addressed the concern. Discussion ensued about payment for the

program and waiting lists for summer camp. Mr. Kazmark explained that the deadlines are set to help with planning for the programs.

Tom Conboy, Tuella Avenue, congratulated everyone on a great Community Day. He further talked about the Council he served on doing their due diligence, along with the Clerk. He addressed the State implementing laws and regulations on the municipalities. He discussed things like the 2% cap being passed in Trenton and spoke about the Mayor and Council doing their due diligence when deciding to enter into a shared services agreement with regard to the Building Department. He discussed the testimony in the depositions and stated he wondered as he read them whether he was in the in the same meeting when this was discussed. He stated that he was offended how one of the Councilmen was portrayed in the depositions. He talked about the meetings and discussions which lead up to the shared services agreement. He stated he smells a little payback in these depositions and it bothers him a lot. He referenced the Mayor's comments about this matter at the last meeting. Mr. Conboy then read Judge Conte's original opinion in the shared services court case. He stated he is upset about this matter.

A motion was made by Councilman Colletti and seconded by Councilman Pettigano to adjourn. Motion carried unanimously.
