**AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF ELMWOOD PARK, COUNTY OF
BERGEN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, AMENDING AND SUPPLEMENTING THE
CODE OF THE BOROUGH MORE SPECIFICALLY CHAPTER VII ENTITLED
“TRAFFIC” SECTION 7-23 TURN PROHIBITIONS.**

WHEREAS, the governing body of the Borough of Elmwood Park in the County of Bergen and State of New Jersey, has determined that hazardous conditions exist that require the adoption of traffic regulations prohibiting left hand turns at certain designated addresses and right turn only at other designated addresses; and

WHEREAS, the Council has determined that there is a necessity to regulate traffic so as to prohibit vehicles from making a left-hand turn from:

1. the southbound on Mola Boulevard into 368 Market Street Parking lot (Leone’s Pizzeria); and
2. the Eastbound on Market Street into 357 Market Street Parking lot (Seven Eleven); and
3. the Eastbound on Market Street into 375 Market Street Parking lot (Elmwood Park Diner); and
4. the Westbound on Market Street into 324 Market Street driveway (Saint Leo’s East Driveway); and
5. the Westbound on Market Street into 348 Market Street Parking driveway (Delta Gas Station); and
6. the Northbound on Mola Boulevard into 500 Mola Boulevard driveway (Senior Citizen Center)

WHEREAS, the Council has determined that there is a necessity to regulate traffic so as to require vehicles to make a right hand turn only from:

1. 368 Market Street (Leone’s Pizzeria Parking lot both entrances one on Market Street and one on Mola Boulevard);and
2. 357 Market Street (Seven Eleven both driveways, one on Market Street and one on Mola Boulevard); and
3. 507 Mola Boulevard (Bank of America both driveways); and
4. 348 Market Street (Delta Gas Station both driveways one on Mola Boulevard and one on Market Street); and
5. 324 Market Street (Saint Leo’s east Driveway); and
6. 505 Mola Boulevard (both driveways) and 500 Mola Boulevard (Senior Citizens Center driveway)

WHEREAS, the Borough of Elmwood Park believes that these traffic regulations are necessary in order to protect the health, safety and welfare of those individuals who reside in the area of these designated intersections, as well as the safety of the public at large.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the Borough of Elmwood Park in the County of Bergen and State of New Jersey, as follows:

SECTION 1. That Chapter VII, “Traffic”, of the General Ordinances of the Borough of Elmwood Park, New Jersey is hereby amended and supplemented at ***Section 7-23 Turn Prohibitions*** to reflect that in accordance with the provisions of section 7-23 no person shall make a left-hand turn from:

1. Southbound on Mola Boulevard into 368 Market Street Parking lot (Leone’s Pizzeria); and
2. Eastbound on Market Street into 357 Market Street Parking lot (Seven Eleven); and
3. Eastbound on Market Street into 375 Market Street Parking lot (Elmwood Park Diner); and
4. Westbound on Market Street into 324 Market Street driveway (Saint Leo’s East Driveway); and
5. Westbound on Market Street into 348 Market Street Parking driveway (Delta Gas Station); and
6. Northbound on Mola Boulevard into 500 Mola Boulevard driveway (Senior Citizen Center)

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED That Chapter VII, “Traffic”, of the General Ordinances of the Borough of Elmwood Park, New Jersey is hereby amended and supplemented at ***Section 7-23 Turn Prohibitions*** to reflect that in accordance with the provisions of section 7-23 no person shall make a left hand turn and require that all vehicles shall make a right hand turn only from:

1. Hillman Drive at Mola Boulevard; and
2. 368 Market Street (Leone’s Pizzeria Parking lot both entrances one on Market Street and one on Mola Boulevard);and
3. 357 Market Street (Seven Eleven both driveways, one on Market Street and one on Mola Boulevard); and
4. 507 Mola Boulevard (Bank of America both driveways); and
5. 348 Market Street (Delta Gas Station both driveways one on Mola Boulevard and one on Market Street); and
6. 324 Market Street (Saint Leo’s east Driveway); and
7. 505 Mola Boulevard (both driveways); and
8. 500 Mola Boulevard (Senior Citizens Center driveway)

SECTION 3. That Chapter VII, “Traffic”, of the General Ordinances of the Borough of Elmwood Park, New Jersey is hereby amended and supplemented at ***Section 7-23 Turn Prohibitions*** to reflect that in accordance with the provisions of section 7-23 no person shall make a left-hand turn from:

1. Southbound on Mola Boulevard into 368 Market Street Parking lot (Leone’s Pizzeria); and
2. Eastbound on Market Street into 357 Market Street Parking lot (Seven Eleven); and

3. Eastbound on Market Street into 375 Market Street Parking lot (Elmwood Park Diner); and
4. Westbound on Market Street into 324 Market Street driveway (Saint Leo's East Driveway); and
5. Westbound on Market Street into 348 Market Street Parking driveway (Delta Gas Station); and
6. Northbound on Mola Boulevard into 500 Mola Boulevard driveway (Senior Citizen Center)

SECTION 4. That Chapter VII, "Traffic", of the General Ordinances of the Borough of Elmwood Park, New Jersey is hereby amended and supplemented at ***Section 7-23 Turn Prohibitions*** to reflect that in accordance with the provisions of section 7-23 no person shall make a left hand turn and require that all vehicles shall make a right hand turn only from:

1. At Hillman Drive and Mola Boulevard; and
2. At 368 Market Street (Leone's Pizzeria Parking lot both entrances one on Market Street and one on Mola Boulevard); and
3. At 357 Market Street (Seven Eleven both driveways, one on Market Street and one on Mola Boulevard); and
4. At 507 Mola Boulevard (Bank of America both driveways); and
5. At 348 Market Street (Delta Gas Station both driveways one on Mola Boulevard and one on Market Street); and
6. At 324 Market Street (Saint Leo's east Driveway); and
7. At 505 Mola Boulevard (both driveways) and 500 Mola Boulevard (Senior Citizens Center driveway)

SECTION 5. That this Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon final passage and publication in accordance with the law, but not before receipt of any approvals required by the New Jersey Department of Transportation and/or the County of Bergen.

SECTION 6. That, upon the effective date of this Ordinance, the appropriate Township officials and/or employees shall be authorized to post applicable signs in the affected areas.

SECTION 7. That, upon the effective date of this Ordinance, it shall be illegal for the motoring public to make the left hand turn only and a right hand turn only as referenced above, and the Borough of Elmwood Department shall be authorized to enforce the said traffic regulations as a violation of Section 7-23, "Turn Prohibitions", of the General Ordinances of the Borough of Elmwood Park, New Jersey.

SECTION 8. In the event any section, part or provision of this Ordinance shall be held unconstitutional or invalid by any Court, such holding shall not affect the validity of this Ordinance or any remaining part of this Ordinance other than the part held unconstitutional or invalid.

SECTION 9. All ordinances or parts thereof, which are inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance, are hereby repealed to the extent of their inconsistencies.

SECTION 10. This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its final passage and publication as required by law.

**AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CHAPTER XXVIII OF THE CODE OF THE BOROUGH
OF ELMWOOD PARK ENTITLED FLOOD DAMAGE PREVENTION**

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council have become aware as to the need to revise and amend the existing stormwater control ordinance so as to enable the Municipality to continue to participate in the National Flood Insurance Program, in order to protect the health and safety of the residents of the Borough of Elmwood Park.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Elmwood Park,

County of Bergen, and State of New Jersey that the following shall be adopted and shall amend and replace the existing ordinance where its applicable and be replaced with the following and that same shall supersede any and all inconsistent language and any and all inconsistencies between this ordinance as to the existing ordinance the present adopted ordinance shall govern.

SECTION 28-1.0

**STATUTORY AUTHORIZATION, FINDINGS OF FACT, PURPOSE AND OBJECTIVES
28-1 STATUTORY AUTHORIZATION**

The Legislature of the State of New Jersey has in N.J.S.A. 40:48-1, et seq., delegated the responsibility to local governmental units to adopt regulations designed to promote public health, safety, and general welfare of its citizenry. Therefore, the governing body of the Borough of Elmwood Park of Bergen County, New Jersey does ordain as follows:

28-2 FINDINGS OF FACT

- a) The flood hazard areas of the Borough of Elmwood Park are subject to periodic inundation which results in loss of life and property, health and safety hazards, disruption of commerce and governmental services, extraordinary public expenditures for flood protection and relief, and impairment of the tax base, all of which adversely affect the public health, safety, and general welfare.
- b) These flood losses are caused by the cumulative effect of obstructions in areas of special flood hazard which increase flood heights and velocities, and when inadequately anchored, causes damage in other areas. Uses that are inadequately floodproofed, elevated or otherwise protected from flood damage also contribute to the flood loss.

28-3 STATEMENT OF PURPOSE

It is the purpose of this ordinance to promote the public health, safety, and general welfare, and to minimize public and private losses due to flood conditions in specific areas by provisions designed to:

- a) Protect human life and health;
- b) Minimize expenditure of public money for costly flood control projects;
- c) Minimize the need for rescue and relief efforts associated with flooding and generally undertaken at the expense of the general public;
- d) Minimize prolonged business interruptions;
- e) Minimize damage to public facilities and utilities such as water and gas mains, electric, telephone and sewer lines, streets, bridges located in areas of special flood hazard;
- f) Help maintain a stable tax base by providing for the sound use and development of areas of special flood hazard so as to minimize future flood blight areas;
- g) Ensure that potential buyers are notified that property is in an area of special flood hazard; and
- h) Ensure that those who occupy the areas of special flood hazard assume responsibility for their actions.

28-4 METHODS OF REDUCING FLOOD LOSSES

In order to accomplish its purposes, this ordinance includes methods and provisions for:

- a) Restricting or prohibiting uses which are dangerous to health, safety, and property due to water or erosion hazards, or which result in damaging increases in erosion or in flood heights or velocities;
- b) Requiring that uses vulnerable to floods including facilities which serve such uses, be protected against flood damage at the time of initial construction;
- c) Controlling the alteration of natural floodplains, stream channels, and natural protective barriers, which help accommodate or channel flood waters;
- d) Controlling filling, grading, dredging, and other development which may increase flood damage; and,
- e) Preventing or regulating the construction of flood barriers which will unnaturally divert flood waters, or which may increase flood hazards in other areas.

SECTION 28-5

DEFINITIONS

Unless specifically defined below, words or phrases used in this ordinance shall be interpreted so as to give them the meaning they have in common usage and to give this ordinance its most reasonable application.

AH Zone- Areas subject to inundation by 1-percent-annual-chance shallow flooding (usually areas of ponding) where average depths are between one and three feet. Base Flood Elevations (BFEs) derived from detailed hydraulic analyses are shown in this zone

AO Zone- Areas subject to inundation by 1-percent-annual-chance shallow flooding (usually sheet flow on sloping terrain) where average depths are between one and three feet.

Appeal — A request for a review of the Zoning Official's interpretation of any provision of this ordinance or a request for a variance shall be to the planning board of the municipality.

Area of Shallow Flooding — A designated AO or AH zone on a community's Digital Flood Insurance Rate Map (DFIRM) with a one percent annual or greater chance of flooding to an average depth of one to three feet where a clearly defined channel does not exist, where the path of flooding is unpredictable and where velocity flow may be evident. Such flooding is characterized by ponding or sheet flow.

Area of Special Flood Hazard — Land in the floodplain within a community subject to a one percent or greater chance of flooding in any given year. It is shown on the FIRM as Zone V, VE, V1-30, A, AO, A1-A30, AE, A99, or AH.

Base Flood — A flood having a one (1%) percent chance of being equaled or exceeded in any given year.

Base Flood Elevation (BFE) — The flood elevation shown on a published Flood Insurance Study (FIS) including the Flood Insurance Rate Map (FIRM). For zones AE, AH, AO, and A1-30 the elevation represents the water surface elevation resulting from a flood that has a 1-percent or greater chance of being equaled or exceeded in any given year.

Basement — Any area of the building having its floor subgrade (below ground level) on all sides.

Breakaway Wall — A wall that is not part of the structural support of the building and is intended through its design and construction to collapse under specific lateral loading forces without causing damage to the elevated portion of the building or supporting foundation system.

Cumulative Substantial Improvement — Any reconstruction, rehabilitation, addition, or other improvement of a structure that equals or exceeds 50 percent [lower threshold – e.g.: replace 50 percent with 40 percent] of the market value of the structure at the time of the improvement or repair when counted cumulatively for 10 years.

Development — Any man-made change to improved or unimproved real estate, including but not limited to buildings or other structures, mining, dredging, filling, grading, paving, excavation or

drilling operations, or storage of equipment or materials located within the area of special flood hazard.

Elevated Building — A non-basement building (i) built, in the case of a building in an Area of Special Flood Hazard, to have the top of the elevated floor, elevated above the base flood elevation plus freeboard by means of piling, columns (posts and piers), or shear walls parallel to the flow of the water, and (ii) adequately anchored so as not to impair the structural integrity of the building during a flood up to the magnitude of the base flood. In an Area of Special Flood Hazard "elevated building" also includes a building elevated by means of fill or solid foundation perimeter walls with openings sufficient to facilitate the unimpeded movement of flood waters.

Erosion — The process of gradual wearing away of land masses.

Existing Manufactured Home Park or Subdivision — A manufactured home park or subdivision for which the construction of facilities for servicing the lots on which the manufactured homes are to be affixed (including, at a minimum, the installation of utilities, the construction of streets, and either final site grading or the pouring of concrete pads) is completed before the effective date of the floodplain management regulations adopted by a community.

Flood or Flooding — A general and temporary condition of partial or complete inundation of normally dry land areas from:

- a) The overflow of inland or tidal waters and/or
- b) The unusual and rapid accumulation or runoff of surface waters from any source.

Flood Insurance Rate Map (FIRM) — The official map on which the Federal Insurance Administration has delineated both the areas of special flood hazards and the risk premium zones applicable to the community.

Flood Insurance Study (FIS) — The official report in which the Federal Insurance Administration has provided flood profiles, as well as the Flood Insurance Rate Map(s) and the water surface elevation of the base flood.

Floodplain Management Regulations — Zoning ordinances, subdivision regulations, building codes, health regulations, special purpose ordinances (such as a floodplain ordinance, grading ordinance and erosion control ordinance) and other applications of police power. The term describes such State or local regulations, in any combination thereof, which provide standards for the purpose of flood damage prevention and reduction.

Floodproofing — Any combination of structural and nonstructural additions, changes, or adjustments to structures which reduce or eliminate flood damage to real estate or improved real property, water and sanitary facilities, structures and their contents.

Floodway — The channel of a river or other watercourse and the adjacent land areas that must be reserved in order to discharge the base flood without cumulatively increasing the water surface elevation more than 0.2 foot.

Freeboard — A factor of safety usually expressed in feet above a flood level for purposes of flood plain management. "Freeboard" tends to compensate for the many unknown factors that could contribute to flood heights greater than the height calculated for a selected size flood and floodway conditions, such as wave action, bridge openings, and the hydrological effect of urbanization of the watershed.

Highest Adjacent Grade — The highest natural elevation of the ground surface prior to construction next to the proposed or existing walls of a structure.

Historic Structure — Any structure that is:

- a) Listed individually in the National Register of Historic Places (a listing maintained by the Department of Interior) or preliminarily determined by the Secretary of the Interior as meeting the requirements for individual listing on the National Register;

- b) Certified or preliminarily determined by the Secretary of the Interior as contributing to the historical significance of a registered historic district or a district preliminarily determined by the Secretary to qualify as a registered historic district;
- c) Individually listed on a State inventory of historic places in States with historic preservation programs which have been approved by the Secretary of the Interior; or
- d) Individually listed on a local inventory of historic places in communities with historic preservation programs that have been certified either:
 - (1) By an approved State program as determined by the Secretary of the Interior; or
 - (2) Directly by the Secretary of the Interior in States without approved programs.

Lowest Floor — The lowest floor of the lowest enclosed area (including basement). An unfinished or flood resistant enclosure, usable solely for the parking of vehicles, building access or storage in an area other than a basement is not considered a building's lowest floor provided that such enclosure is not built so to render the structure in violation of other applicable non-elevation design requirements of 44 CFR Section 60.3.

Manufactured Home — A structure, transportable in one or more sections, which is built on a permanent chassis and is designed for use with or without a permanent foundation when attached to the required utilities. The term "manufactured home" does not include a "recreational vehicle".

Manufactured Home Park or Manufactured Home Subdivision — A parcel (or contiguous parcels) of land divided into two (2) or more manufactured home lots for rent or sale.

New Construction — Structures for which the start of construction commenced on or after the effective date of a floodplain regulation adopted by a community and includes any subsequent improvements to such structures.

New Manufactured Home Park or Subdivision — A manufactured home park or subdivision for which the construction of facilities for servicing the lots on which the manufactured homes are to be affixed (including at a minimum, the installation of utilities, the construction of streets, and either final site grading or the pouring of concrete pads) is completed on or after the effective date of the floodplain management regulations adopted by the municipality.

Recreational Vehicle — A vehicle which is [i] built on a single chassis; [ii] 400 square feet or less when measured at the longest horizontal projections; [iii] designed to be self-propelled or permanently towable by a light duty truck; and [iv] designed primarily not for use as a permanent dwelling but as temporary living quarters for recreational, camping, travel, or seasonal use.

Start of Construction — (For other than new construction or substantial improvements under the Coastal Barrier Resources Act (P.L. No. 97-348)) includes substantial improvements and means the date the building permit was issued, provided the actual start of construction, repair, reconstruction, rehabilitation, addition, placement, or other improvement was within 180 days of the permit date. The actual start means either the first placement of permanent construction of a structure on a site such as the pouring of a slab or footings, the installation of pilings, the construction of columns, or any work beyond the stage of excavation, or the placement of a manufactured home on a foundation.

Permanent construction does not include land preparation, such as clearing, grading and filling nor does it include the installation of streets and/or walkways, nor does it include excavation for a basement, footings or piers, or foundations or the erection of temporary forms, nor does it include the installation on the property of accessory buildings, such as garages or sheds not occupied as dwelling units or not part of the main structure. For a substantial improvement, the actual start of construction means the first alteration of any wall, ceiling, floor, or other structural part of a building, whether or not that alteration affects the external dimensions of the building.

Structure — A walled and roofed building, a manufactured home, or a gas or liquid storage tank that is principally above ground.

Substantial Damage — Damage of any origin sustained by a structure whereby the cost of restoring the structure to its before damaged condition would equal or exceed fifty (50) percent of the market value of the structure before the damage occurred. Substantial Damage also means flood-related damages sustained by a structure on two or more separate occasions during a 10-year period for which the cost of repairs at the time of each such flood event, on the average, equals or exceeds 25 percent of the market value of the structure before the damages occurred.

Substantial Improvement — Any reconstruction, rehabilitation, addition, or other improvement of a structure during a 10-year period the cost of which equals or exceeds fifty (50) percent of the market value of the structure before the "start of construction" of the improvement. Substantial improvement also means "cumulative substantial improvement." This term includes structures which have incurred "substantial damage", regardless of the actual repair work performed or "repetitive loss". The term does not, however, include either:

- (1) Any project for improvement of a structure to correct existing violations of State or local health, sanitary or safety code specifications which have been identified by the local code enforcement officer and which are the minimum necessary to assure safe living conditions; or
- (2) Any alteration of a "historic structure", provided that the alteration will not preclude the structure's continued designation as a "historic structure".

Variance — A grant of relief from the requirements of this ordinance that permits construction in a manner that would otherwise be prohibited by this ordinance.

Violation — The failure of a structure or other development to be fully compliant with this ordinance. A new or substantially improved structure or other development without the elevation certificate, other certifications, or other evidence of compliance required in 44 CFR §60.3(b)(5), (c)(4), (c)(10), (e)(2), (e)(4), or (e)(5) is presumed to be in violation until such time as that documentation is provided.

SECTION 28-6 GENERAL PROVISIONS

28-6.1 LANDS TO WHICH THIS ORDINANCE APPLIES

This ordinance shall apply to all areas of special flood hazards within the jurisdiction of the Borough of Elmwood Park, Bergen County, New Jersey.

28-6.2 BASIS FOR ESTABLISHING THE AREAS OF SPECIAL FLOOD HAZARD

The areas of special flood hazard for the Borough of Elmwood Park, Community No. _____ are identified and defined on the following documents prepared by the Federal Emergency Management Agency:

- a) A scientific and engineering report "Flood Insurance Study, Bergen County, New Jersey (All Jurisdictions)" dated February 28, 2019.
- b) "Flood Insurance Rate Map for Bergen County, New Jersey (All Jurisdictions)" as shown on Index and panels are #34003C0167H, 34003C0169H, 34003C0186H, 34003C0188H whose effective date is August 28, 2019.

The above documents are hereby adopted and declared to be a part of this ordinance. The Flood Insurance Study, maps and advisory documents are on file at the Borough Clerk, Municipal Building of Elmwood Park, 182 Market Street, Elmwood Park, New Jersey.

28-6.3 PENALTIES FOR NONCOMPLIANCE

No structure or land shall hereafter be constructed, re-located to, extended, converted, or altered without full compliance with the terms of this ordinance and other applicable regulations. Violation of the provisions of this ordinance by failure to comply with any of its requirements (including violations of conditions and safeguards established in connection with conditions) shall constitute a misdemeanor. Any person who violates this ordinance or fails to comply with any of its requirements shall upon conviction thereof be fined not more than \$ 500.00 or

imprisoned for not more than 90 days, or both, for each violation, and in addition shall pay all costs and expenses involved in the case. Nothing herein contained shall prevent the Borough of Elmwood Park, from taking such other lawful action as is necessary to prevent or remedy any violation.

28-6.4 ABROGATION AND GREATER RESTRICTIONS

This ordinance is not intended to repeal, abrogate, or impair any existing easements, covenants, or deed restrictions. However, where this ordinance and other ordinance, easement, covenant, or deed restriction conflict or overlap, whichever imposes the more stringent restrictions shall prevail.

28-6.5 INTERPRETATION

In the interpretation and application of this ordinance, all provisions shall be:

- a) Considered as minimum requirements;
- b) Liberally construed in favor of the governing body; and,
- c) Deemed neither to limit nor repeal any other powers granted under State statutes.

28-6.6 WARNING AND DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

The degree of flood protection required by this ordinance is considered reasonable for regulatory purposes and is based on scientific and engineering considerations. Larger floods can and will occur on rare occasions. Flood heights may be increased by man-made or natural causes. This ordinance does not imply that land outside the area of special flood hazards or uses permitted within such areas will be free from flooding or flood damages.

This ordinance shall not create liability on the part of the Borough of Elmwood Park, any officer or employee thereof or the Federal Insurance Administration, for any flood damages that result from reliance on this ordinance or any administrative decision lawfully made thereunder.

SECTION 28-7

ADMINISTRATION

28-7.1 ESTABLISHMENT OF DEVELOPMENT PERMIT

A Development Permit shall be obtained before construction or development begins, including placement of manufactured homes, within any area of special flood hazard established in section 6.2. Application for a Development Permit shall be made on forms furnished by the Zoning Official and may include, but not be limited to; plans in duplicate drawn to scale showing the nature, location, dimensions, and elevations of the area in question; existing or proposed structures, fill, storage of materials, drainage facilities; and the location of the foregoing. Specifically, the following information is required:

- a) Elevation in relation to mean sea level, of the lowest floor (including basement) of all structures;
- b) Elevation in relation to mean sea level to which any structure has been floodproofed.
- c) Certification by a registered professional engineer or architect that the floodproofing methods for any nonresidential structure meet the floodproofing criteria in section 5; and,
- d) Description of the extent to which any watercourse will be altered or relocated as a result of proposed development.

28-7.2 DESIGNATION OF THE LOCAL ADMINISTRATOR

The Zoning Official is hereby appointed to administer and implement this ordinance by granting or denying development permit applications in accordance with its provisions.

28-7.3 DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE ADMINISTRATOR

Duties of the Zoning Official shall include, but not be limited to:

a) PERMIT REVIEW

1. Review all development permits to determine that the permit requirements of this ordinance have been satisfied.
2. Review all development permits to determine that all necessary permits have been obtained from those Federal, State or local governmental agencies from which prior approval is required.
3. Review all development permits to determine if the proposed development is located in the floodway. If located in the floodway, assure that the encroachment provisions of 5 are met.

28-7.4 USE OF OTHER BASE FLOOD AND FLOODWAY DATA

When base flood elevation and floodway data has not been provided in accordance with section 6.2, BASIS FOR ESTABLISHING THE AREAS OF SPECIAL FLOOD HAZARD, the Zoning Official shall obtain, review, and reasonably utilize any base flood elevation and floodway data available from a Federal, State or other source, in order to administer sections 9.7, 9.8 SPECIFIC STANDARDS, RESIDENTIAL CONSTRUCTION, and 9.7, 9.9 SPECIFIC STANDARDS, NONRESIDENTIAL CONSTRUCTION.

28-7.5 INFORMATION TO BE OBTAINED AND MAINTAINED

- a) Obtain and record the actual elevation (in relation to mean sea level) of the lowest floor (including basement) of all new or substantially improved structures, and whether or not the structure contains a basement.
- b) For all new or substantially improved floodproofed structures:
 - i. verify and record the actual elevation (in relation to mean sea level); and
 - ii. maintain the floodproofing certifications required in section 9.9.
- c) Maintain for public inspection all records pertaining to the provisions of this ordinance.

28-7.6 ALTERATION OF WATERCOURSES

- a) Notify adjacent communities and the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection, Bureau of Flood Control and the Land Use Regulation Program prior to any alteration or relocation of a watercourse and submit evidence of such notification to the Federal Insurance Administration.
- b) Require that maintenance is provided within the altered or relocated portion of said watercourse so the flood carrying capacity is not diminished.

28-7.7 SUBSTANTIAL DAMAGE REVIEW

- a) After an event resulting in building damages, assess the damage to structures due to flood and non-flood causes.
- b) Record and maintain the flood and non-flood damage of substantial damage structures and provide a letter of Substantial Damage Determination to the owner and the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection, Bureau of Flood Control.
- c) Ensure substantial improvements meet the requirements of sections 9.7- 9.8, SPECIFIC STANDARDS, RESIDENTIAL CONSTRUCTION, 9.7-9.9, SPECIFIC STANDARDS, NONRESIDENTIAL CONSTRUCTION and 9.7-9.10, SPECIFIC STANDARDS, MANUFACTURED HOMES.

28-7.8 INTERPRETATION OF FIRM BOUNDARIES

Make interpretations where needed, as to the exact location of the boundaries of the areas of special flood hazards (for example, where there appears to be a conflict between a mapped boundary and actual field conditions). The person contesting the location of the boundary shall be given a reasonable opportunity to appeal the interpretation as provided in section 28-8.

28-8 VARIANCE PROCEDURE

28-8.1 APPEAL BOARD

- a) The Board of Adjustment shall hear and decide appeals and requests for variances from the requirements of this ordinance.
- b) The Board of Adjustment shall hear and decide appeals when it is alleged there is an error in any requirement, decision, or determination made by the Zoning Official in the enforcement or administration of this ordinance.
- c) Those aggrieved by the decision of the Board of Adjustment, or any taxpayer, may appeal such decision to the Superior Court, as provided in ordinance and state statute.
- d) In passing upon such applications, the Board of Adjustment, shall consider all technical evaluations, all relevant factors, standards specified in other sections of this ordinance, and:
 - i. the danger that materials may be swept onto other lands to the injury of others;
 - ii. the danger to life and property due to flooding or erosion damage;
 - iii. the susceptibility of the proposed facility and its contents to flood damage and the effect of such damage on the individual owner;
 - iv. the importance of the services provided by the proposed facility to the community;
 - v. the necessity to the facility of a waterfront location, where applicable;
 - vi. the availability of alternative locations for the proposed use which are not subject to flooding or erosion damage;
 - vii. the compatibility of the proposed use with existing and anticipated development;
 - viii. the relationship of the proposed use to the comprehensive plan and floodplain management program of that area;
 - ix. the safety of access to the property in times of flood for ordinary and emergency vehicles;
 - x. the expected heights, velocity, duration, rate of rise, and sediment transport of the flood waters and the effects of wave action, if applicable, expected at the site; and,
 - xi. the costs of providing governmental services during and after flood conditions, including maintenance and repair of public utilities and facilities such as sewer, gas, electrical, and water systems, and streets and bridges.
- e) Upon consideration of the factors of section 28-8 1d) and the purposes of this ordinance, the Board of Adjustment may attach such conditions to the granting of variances as it deems necessary to further the purposes of this ordinance.
- f) The Zoning Official shall maintain the records of all appeal actions, including technical information, and report any variances to the Federal Insurance Administration upon request.

28-8.2 CONDITIONS FOR VARIANCES

- a) Generally, variances may be issued for new construction and substantial improvements to be erected on a lot of one-half acre or less in size contiguous to and surrounded by lots with existing structures constructed below the base flood level, providing items i.-xi. in section 28-8 1d) have been fully considered. As the lot size increases beyond the one-half acre, the technical justification required for issuing the variance increases.
- b) Variances may be issued for the repair or rehabilitation of historic structures upon a determination that the proposed repair or rehabilitation will not preclude the structure's continued designation as a historic structure and the variance is the minimum necessary to preserve the historic character and design of the structure.
- c) Variances shall not be issued within any designated floodway if any increase in flood levels during the base flood discharge would result.
- d) Variances shall only be issued upon a determination that the variance is the minimum necessary, considering the flood hazard, to afford relief.
- e) Variances shall only be issued upon:
 - i. A showing of good and sufficient cause;
 - ii. A determination that failure to grant the variance would result in exceptional hardship to the applicant; and,
 - iii. A determination that the granting of a variance will not result in increased flood heights, additional threats to public safety, extraordinary public expense, create nuisances, cause fraud on or victimization of the public as identified in section 28-8 1d), or conflict with existing local laws or ordinances.
- f) Any applicant to whom a variance is granted shall be given written notice that the structure will be permitted to be built with a lowest floor elevation below the base flood elevation and that the cost of flood insurance will be commensurate with the increased risk resulting from the reduced lowest floor elevation.

SECTION 28-9

PROVISIONS FOR FLOOD HAZARD REDUCTION

28-9.1 GENERAL STANDARDS

In all areas of special flood hazards, compliance with the applicable requirements of the Uniform Construction Code (N.J.A.C. 5:23) and the following standards, whichever is more restrictive, is required:

28-9.2 ANCHORING

- a) All new construction and substantial improvements shall be anchored to prevent flotation, collapse, or lateral movement of the structure.
- b) All manufactured homes to be placed or substantially improved shall be anchored to resist flotation, collapse or lateral movement. Methods of anchoring may include, but are not to be limited to, use of over-the-top or frame ties to ground anchors. This requirement is in addition to applicable state and local anchoring requirements for resisting wind forces.

28-9.3 CONSTRUCTION MATERIALS AND METHODS

- a) All new construction and substantial improvements shall be constructed with materials and utility equipment resistant to flood damage.
- b) All new construction and substantial improvements shall be constructed using methods and practices that minimize flood damage.

28-9.4 UTILITIES

- a) All new and replacement water supply systems shall be designed to minimize or eliminate infiltration of flood waters into the system;
- b) New and replacement sanitary sewage systems shall be designed to minimize or eliminate infiltration of flood waters into the systems and discharge from the systems into flood waters;
- c) On-site waste disposal systems shall be located to avoid impairment to them or contamination from them during flooding; and
- d) For all new construction and substantial improvements, the electrical, heating, ventilation, plumbing and air-conditioning equipment and other service facilities shall be designed and/or located so as to prevent water from entering or accumulating within the components during conditions of flooding.

28-9.5 SUBDIVISION PROPOSALS

- a) All subdivision proposals and other proposed new development shall be consistent with the need to minimize flood damage;
- b) All subdivision proposals and other proposed new development shall have public utilities and facilities such as sewer, gas, electrical, and water systems located and constructed to minimize flood damage;
- c) All subdivision proposals and other proposed new development shall have adequate drainage provided to reduce exposure to flood damage; and,
- d) Base flood elevation data shall be provided for subdivision proposals and other proposed new development which contain at least fifty (50) lots or five (5) acres (whichever is less).

28-9.6 ENCLOSURE OPENINGS

All new construction and substantial improvements having fully enclosed areas below the lowest floor that are usable solely for parking of vehicles, building access or storage in an area other than a basement and which are subject to flooding shall be designed to automatically equalize hydrostatic flood forces on exterior walls by allowing for the entry and exit of floodwaters. Designs for meeting this requirement must either be certified by a registered professional engineer or architect or must meet or exceed the following minimum criteria: A

minimum of two (2) openings in at least two (2) exterior walls of each enclosed area, having a total net area of not less than one (1) square inch for every square foot of enclosed area subject to flooding shall be provided. The bottom of all openings shall be no higher than one (1) foot above grade. Openings may be equipped with screens, louvers, or other covering or devices provided that they permit the automatic entry and exit of floodwaters.

28-9.7 SPECIFIC STANDARDS

In all areas of special flood hazards where base flood elevation data have been provided as set forth in section 28-6.2, BASIS FOR ESTABLISHING THE AREAS OF SPECIAL FLOOD HAZARD or in section 28-7.4, USE OF OTHER BASE FLOOD DATA, the following standards are required:

28-9.8 RESIDENTIAL CONSTRUCTION

- a) New construction and substantial improvement of any residential structure located in an A or AE zone shall have the lowest floor, including basement together with the attendant utilities (including all electrical, heating, ventilating, air-conditioning and other service equipment) and sanitary facilities, elevated at or above the more restrictive, base flood elevation plus one (1) foot, or as required by ASCE/SEI 24-14, Table 2-1.
- b) Require within any AO or AH zone on the municipality's DFIRM that all new construction and substantial improvement of any residential structure shall have the lowest floor, including basement together with the attendant utilities and sanitary facilities, elevated above the depth number specified in feet plus one (1) foot, above the highest adjacent grade at least three (3) feet if no depth number is specified and, require adequate drainage paths around structures on slopes to guide floodwaters around and away from proposed structures.

28-9.9 NONRESIDENTIAL CONSTRUCTION

In an Area of Special Flood Hazard, all new construction and substantial improvement of any commercial, industrial or other nonresidential structure located in an A or AE zone shall have the lowest floor, including basement together with the attendant utilities and sanitary facilities as well as all electrical, heating, ventilating, air-conditioning and other service equipment:

either

- a) Elevated at or above the more restrictive, base flood elevation plus one (1) foot, or as required by ASCE/SEI 24-14, Table 2-1.; and
- b) Require within any AO or AH zone on the municipality's FIRM to elevate above the depth number specified in feet plus one (1) foot, above the highest adjacent grade at least three (3) feet if no depth number is specified and, require adequate drainage paths around structures on slopes to guide floodwaters around and away from proposed structures; or
- c) Be floodproofed so that below the more restrictive, base flood elevation plus one (1) foot, or as required by ASCE/SEI 24-14, Table 6-1, the structure is watertight with walls substantially impermeable to the passage of water;
- d) Have structural components capable of resisting hydrostatic and hydrodynamic loads and effects of buoyancy; and,
- e) Be certified by a registered professional engineer or architect that the design and methods of construction are in accordance with accepted standards of practice for meeting the applicable provisions of this subsection. Such certification shall be provided to the official as set forth in section 7.5.

28-9.10 MANUFACTURED HOMES

- a) Manufactured homes shall be anchored in accordance with section 9.2.
- b) All manufactured homes to be placed or substantially improved within an area of special flood hazard shall:
 - i. Be consistent with the need to minimize flood damage,
 - ii. Be constructed to minimize flood damage,

- iii. Have adequate drainage provided to reduce exposure to flood damage,
- iv. Be elevated on a permanent foundation such that the top of the lowest floor is at or above the more restrictive, base flood elevation plus one (1) foot, or as required by ASCE/SEI 24-14, Table 2-1,
- v. The manufactured home chassis is supported by reinforced piers or other foundation elements of at least equivalent strength that are no less than 36 inches in height above grade and be securely anchored to an adequately anchored foundation system to resist floatation, collapse, and lateral movement.

28-9.11 FLOODWAYS

Located within areas of special flood hazard established in section 28-6.2 are areas designated as floodways. Since the floodway is an extremely hazardous area due to the velocity of flood waters which carry debris, potential projectiles, and erosion potential, the following provisions apply:

- a) Prohibit encroachments, including fill, new construction, substantial improvements, and other development unless a technical evaluation demonstrates that encroachment shall not result in any increase in flood levels during the occurrence of the base flood discharge.
- b) If the section above is satisfied, all new construction and substantial improvements must comply with section 28-9 PROVISIONS FOR FLOOD HAZARD REDUCTION.
- c) In all areas of special flood hazard in which base flood elevation data has been provided and no floodway has been designated, the accumulative effect of any proposed development, when combined with all other existing and anticipated development, shall not increase the water surface elevation of the base flood more than two-tenths (0.2) of a foot at any point.

SECTION 28-10

SEVERABILITY

If any section, subsection, paragraph, sentence, clause, or phrase of this Ordinance shall be declared invalid for any reason whatsoever, such a decision shall not affect the remaining portions of the Ordinance, which shall remain in full force and effect, and for this purpose the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby declared to be severable.

SECTION 26-11

ENACTMENT

26-11.1 ADOPTION

This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its final passage and publication as required by law.

Introduced: June 20, 2019

Adopted:

A motion was made by Councilwoman Wechtler and seconded by Councilman Dombrowski to open the floor for public comment. Motion carried unanimously.

Jeffrey Freitag, Hillman Drive, asked the Mayor and Council if there would need to be a new ordinance should they decide to only move forward with purchasing only one piece of equipment. Acting Borough Clerk Delaney advised Mr. Freitag that a new ordinance would not be needed.

Kenneth Pressler, Hamilton Avenue, expressed his concerns as a Volunteer Firefighter as the purchased of the mini-pumper piece of equipment was not presented to the entire Fire Department as a whole. He stated that some members of the Fire Department are not in favor of purchasing said equipment. The Mayor and Council stated they understand his concerns and that a purchase will not be made until all Department Chiefs are consulted. They also questioned where the disconnect was as discussions began back in November regarding these purchases.

BOND ORDINANCE TO AUTHORIZE THE ACQUISITION OF A NEW AERIAL TOWER FIRE TRUCK AND A NEW MINI-PUMPER FIRE ENGINE, INCLUDING ORIGINAL APPARATUS AND EQUIPMENT, IN, BY AND FOR THE BOROUGH OF ELMWOOD PARK, IN THE COUNTY OF BERGEN, NEW JERSEY, TO APPROPRIATE THE SUM OF \$1,740,000 TO PAY THE COST THEREOF, TO MAKE A DOWN PAYMENT, TO AUTHORIZE THE ISSUANCE OF BONDS TO FINANCE SUCH APPROPRIATION AND TO PROVIDE FOR THE ISSUANCE OF BOND ANTICIPATION NOTES IN ANTICIPATION OF THE ISSUANCE OF SUCH BONDS.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Borough Council of the Borough of Elmwood Park, in the County of Bergen, New Jersey, as follows:

Section 1. The Borough of Elmwood Park, in the County of Bergen, State of New Jersey (the "Borough") is hereby authorized to acquire a new aerial tower fire truck and a new mini-pumper fire engine, including original apparatus and equipment, in, by and for said Borough. Said improvements shall include all work, materials and appurtenances necessary and suitable therefor.

Section 2. The sum of \$1,740,000 is hereby appropriated to the payment of the cost of making the improvements described in Section 1 hereof (hereinafter referred to as "purpose"). Said appropriation shall be met from the proceeds of the sale of the bonds authorized and the down payment appropriated by this ordinance. Said improvements shall be made as general improvements and no part of the cost thereof shall be assessed against property specially benefited.

Section 3. It is hereby determined and stated that (1) the making of such improvements is not a current expense of said Borough, and (2) it is necessary to finance said purpose by the issuance of obligations of said Borough pursuant to the Local Bond Law (Chapter 2 of Title 40A of the New Jersey Statutes Annotated, as amended; the "Local Bond Law"), and (3) the estimated cost of said purpose is \$1,740,000, and (4) \$83,000 of said sum is to be provided by the down payment hereinafter appropriated to finance said purpose, and (5) the estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes necessary to be issued for said purpose is \$1,657,000, and (6) the cost of such purpose, as hereinbefore stated, includes the aggregate amount of \$154,000 which is estimated to be necessary to finance the cost of such purpose, including architect's fees,

accounting, engineering and inspection costs, legal expenses and other expenses, including interest on such obligations to the extent permitted by Section 20 of the Local Bond Law.

Section 4. It is hereby determined and stated that moneys exceeding \$83,000, appropriated for down payments on capital improvements or for the capital improvement fund in budgets heretofore adopted for said Borough, are now available to finance said purpose. The sum of \$83,000 is hereby appropriated from such moneys to the payment of the cost of said purpose.

Section 5. To finance said purpose, bonds of said Borough of an aggregate principal amount not exceeding \$1,657,000 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to the Local Bond Law. Said bonds shall bear interest at a rate per annum as may be hereafter determined within the limitations prescribed by law. All matters with respect to said bonds not determined by this ordinance shall be determined by resolutions to be hereafter adopted.

Section 6. To finance said purpose, bond anticipation notes of said Borough of an aggregate principal amount not exceeding \$1,657,000 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to the Local Bond Law in anticipation of the issuance of said bonds. In the event that bonds are issued pursuant to this ordinance, the aggregate amount of notes hereby authorized to be issued shall be reduced by an amount equal to the principal amount of the bonds so issued. If the aggregate amount of outstanding bonds and notes issued pursuant to this ordinance shall at any time exceed the sum first mentioned in this section, the moneys raised by the issuance of said bonds shall, to not less than the amount of such excess, be applied to the payment of such notes then outstanding.

Section 7. Each bond anticipation note issued pursuant to this ordinance shall be dated on or about the date of its issuance and shall be payable not more than one year from its date, shall bear interest at a rate per annum as may be hereafter determined within the limitations prescribed by law and may be renewed from time to time pursuant to and within limitations prescribed by the Local Bond Law. Each of said notes shall be signed by the Mayor and by a financial officer and shall be under the seal of said Borough and attested by the Borough Clerk or Deputy Borough Clerk. Said officers are hereby authorized to execute said notes and to issue said notes in such form as they may adopt in conformity with law. The power to determine any matters with respect to said notes not determined by this ordinance and also the power to sell said notes,

is hereby delegated to the Chief Financial Officer, who is hereby authorized to sell said notes either at one time or from time to time in the manner provided by law.

Section 8. It is hereby determined and declared that the period of usefulness of said purpose, according to its reasonable life, is a period of ten years computed from the date of said bonds.

Section 9. It is hereby determined and stated that the Supplemental Debt Statement required by the Local Bond Law has been duly made and filed in the office of the Borough Clerk of said Borough, and that such statement so filed shows that the gross debt of said Borough, as defined in Section 43 of the Local Bond Law, is increased by this ordinance by \$1,657,000 and that the issuance of the bonds and notes authorized by this ordinance will be within all debt limitations prescribed by said Local Bond Law.

Section 10. Any funds received from private parties, the County of Bergen, the State of New Jersey or any of their agencies or any funds received from the United States of America or any of its agencies in aid of such purpose, shall be applied to the payment of the cost of such purpose, or, if bond anticipation notes have been issued, to the payment of the bond anticipation notes, and the amount of bonds authorized for such purpose shall be reduced accordingly.

Section 11. The capital budget is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency therewith and the resolutions promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing full detail of the amended capital budget and capital program as approved by the Director, Division of Local Government Services, is on file with the Borough Clerk and is available for public inspection.

Section 12. The Borough intends to issue the bonds or notes to finance the cost of the improvements described in Section 1 of this bond ordinance. If the Borough incurs such costs prior to the issuance of the bonds or notes, the Borough hereby states its reasonable expectation to reimburse itself for such expenditures with the proceeds of such bonds or notes in the maximum principal amount of bonds or notes authorized by this bond ordinance.

Section 13. The full faith and credit of the Borough are hereby pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and the interest on the obligations authorized by this

ordinance. Said obligations shall be direct, unlimited and general obligations of the Borough, and the Borough shall levy ad valorem taxes upon all the taxable real property within the Borough for the payment of the principal of and interest on such bonds and notes, without limitation as to rate or amount.

Section 14. This ordinance shall take effect twenty days after the first publication thereof after final passage.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF ELMWOOD PARK COUNTY OF BERGEN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, AMENDING AND SUPPLEMENTING THE CODE OF THE BOROUGH AT CHAPTER IV, ENTITLED "LICENSING AND BUSINESSES REGULATION," SO AS TO AMEND SECTION 4.6 ENTITLED "HAWKERS, PEDDLERS AND SOLICITORS" TO ENCLUDE "ROADWAY CHARITABLE SOLICITATION"

WHEREAS, pursuant to **N.J.S.A. 39:4-60**, a municipal governing body may authorize charitable organizations to solicit contributions in the roadway of a highway, other than upon interstate highways or toll roads, subject to the regulations promulgated by the State Department of Transportation in consultation with the Division of Highway Traffic Safety; and

WHEREAS, the State of New Jersey Administrative Code, more specifically, **N.J.A.C. 16:40-3.1** provides that to solicit contributions in the right-of-way of a highway, the charitable organization shall have approval in advance from the respective municipal governing body via ordinance; and

WHEREAS, the governing body desires to allow certain charitable organizations, namely authorized public-school parent groups and volunteer first aid and fire companies, to conduct roadside solicitations and to encourage the fund-raising efforts of these charitable entities.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the governing body of the Borough of Elmwood Park, County of Bergen, State of New Jersey, as follows:

SECTION 1. Chapter IV of the Borough Code, entitled "Licensing and Business Regulation" shall be amended by adding the following:

Roadway Charitable Solicitation

A. Definitions.

The following words and terms, when used in this section, shall have the following meanings, unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:

"Authorized Charitable Organization" means all local public schools, public school organizations, including but not limited to the any locally based charitable organization that hold a 503-tax status from the IRS, the Elmwood Park volunteer First Aid Squad and Fire Companies.

"Charitable Solicitation Permit" means a permit issued by the Department pursuant **NJAC 16:40-3.1 et seq.**

"Department" means the State Department of Transportation.

"Highway" means the public right-of-way whether open or improved or not, including all existing factors or improvements.

"Right-of-way" means State highway property and property rights, including easements, owned and controlled by the Department.

"Roadway Solicitation Permit" means the permit issued by the Borough of Elmwood Park pursuant to this article.

"Shoulder" means the portion of the roadway that lies between the edge of the traveled way and curb line, excluding auxiliary lanes.

"State Highway" means a road owned, taken over, controlled, built, maintained, or otherwise under the jurisdiction of the Department.

“Traveled Way” means the portion of the roadway provided for the movement of vehicles, exclusive of shoulders and auxiliary lanes inclusive of center lines.

B. Authorization.

1. Pursuant to **N.J.S.A. 39:4-60** and **N.J.A.C. 16:40-3.1**, authorized charitable organizations are hereby permitted to solicit contributions in the right-of-way of a highway located within the Borough of Elmwood Park, subject to the provisions and restrictions contained in this chapter.
2. The within authorization is subject to the regulations promulgated by the Department in consultation with the Division of Highway Traffic Safety, as set forth in **N.J.A.C. 16:40-3.1 et seq.**
3. Under no circumstances may an authorized charitable organization conduct a roadway charitable solicitation without first having obtained a permit from the Chief of Police.

C. Permits.

1. An authorized charitable organization seeking issuance of a roadway solicitation permit shall file an application with the Chief of Police on forms provided by the Chief of Police.

(a). An application for a roadway solicitation permit shall be filed with the Chief of Police not less than seven days before the date upon which it is proposed to conduct such roadway solicitation.

(b). Contents of roadway solicitation permit. The application for a roadway solicitation permit shall set forth the following information:

(1). Name, address and telephone number of the authorized charitable organization seeking to conduct a roadway charitable solicitation.

(2) Date and times upon which roadway solicitation is proposed.

(3). Method of roadway charitable solicitation (i.e., coin toss using blankets).

(4). Specific location or locations of proposed roadway charitable solicitation.

(5). Contact person for the authorized charitable organization.

(6). Names of the persons (solicitors) conducting the roadway charitable solicitations on behalf of the authorized charitable organization at each proposed location.

(7). Any additional information which the Chief of Police shall find reasonably necessary for the fair determination as to whether a permit should be issued.

2. If the proposed roadway charitable solicitation is to be conducted upon any county highway or intersection, the authorized charitable organization must submit evidence of approval by the Bergen County Board of Freeholders pursuant to **N.J.S.A. 39:4-60**.

3. If the proposed charitable solicitation is to be conducted upon any state highway or intersection, the authorized charitable organization must submit evidence of approval in the form of a charitable solicitation permit received from the Department of Transportation under **N.J.A.C. 16:40-3.1 et seq.**

(a). The Chief of Police is hereby authorized to sign the charitable solicitation permit on behalf of the Borough.

(b). The Chief of Police has been consulted and shall be responsible for supervising the solicitation and enforcing the terms of the charitable solicitation permit.

(c). The roadway solicitation permit issued by the Borough and the charitable solicitation permit issued by the Department shall be in the possession of the solicitor for the authorized charitable organization during all times of solicitation and be available for inspection by the state, county and Elmwood Park Police Department and enforcement personnel.

D. General Restrictions and Provisions.

1. Solicitation of contributions is prohibited along traffic circles or highway segments determined to be inappropriate in the interest of public safety.
2. Solicitation is permitted only at signalized intersections or when the existing traffic control device causes temporary interruption in the flow of normal traffic, such as at the opening of a movable bridge.
3. Borough police may suspend solicitation operations at any time if any condition of either permit is violated or if, in a police officer's sole discretion, traffic is being impeded or delayed or the public safety is at risk.
4. Solicitation shall be subject to the specific terms and conditions of each permit granted.
5. Solicitation shall not stop traffic or impede the flow of traffic. Traffic shall already be stopped before solicitation may occur and shall cease while traffic is moving. Use of a flag person shall be prohibited.
6. The authorized charitable organization shall be responsible for cleaning up any debris from the roadway.
7. Solicitation shall only be permitted during daylight hours.
8. Solicitors shall not drink alcoholic beverages, use drugs, or be under the influence of drugs or alcohol when soliciting. Solicitors shall not harass the public.
9. Each person soliciting charitable contributions on behalf of the authorized charitable organization shall be at least 18 years of age.

E. Safety Criteria.

1. All solicitors shall wear safety vests that are in accordance with Department standards.
2. Parking of vehicles shall comply with applicable traffic regulations. Off-site parking is recommended.
3. Coin tosses using blankets located off the traveled way are the preferred method of solicitation.
4. The solicitors shall not install any traffic control devices.

F. Signage Requirements.

1. Signs advertising the roadway solicitation are permitted but they must be of temporary construction and break-away to the extent possible.
2. Signage shall be a maximum of 16 square feet.
3. Signage shall be in accordance with the temporary signage standards contained in the Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices.
4. At least two warning signs, if required by the Chief of Police for safety reasons, shall be placed as follows:
 - (a). "CHARITABLE SOLICITATION 500 FEET AHEAD"; and

(b). A second sign following identifying the name of the organization soliciting.

5. Signs shall not be permitted in the traveled way or medians less than eight feet in width.

6. All signs warning, noticing or advertising solicitations shall be removed immediately following the solicitation event.

G. Violations.

Any person guilty of violating a provision of this chapter shall be liable for a fine not to exceed \$100.000 per each day of such violation.

SECTION 2. In the event any section, part or provision of this Ordinance shall be held unconstitutional or invalid by any Court, such holding shall not affect the validity of this Ordinance or any remaining part of this Ordinance other than the part held unconstitutional or invalid.

SECTION 3. All ordinances or parts thereof, which are inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance, are hereby repealed to the extent of their inconsistencies.

SECTION 4. This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its final passage and publication as required by law.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Councilwoman Ingui updated the public on the current number of Ambulance Corps. calls. The Ambulance Corps. recently participated in the drunk driving simulation at the High School and will be on call at the High School graduation. She then announced that they continue to look for volunteers and concluded her report by congratulating the Classes of 2019.

Councilman Dombrowski discussed the number of fire calls for 2019 and recent fire calls. He directed fire safety questions to Fire Official Steve Kochik. Councilman Dombrowski then went on to welcome the new firefighters appointed this evening and congratulated the 2019 graduating students. He concluded his report by asking the public to keep the Leider family in their thoughts and prayers as Jason Leider recently went through a rough battle in the hospital and finally joined his family back at home this evening.

Councilwoman Balistreri reported on the operations of the Department of Public Works in addition to the Recreation Department Summer Camp and Summer Concert series. She then shared details on the most recent Stigma Free/Elmwood Park Takes Action meeting where the June 30th Unity in the Community event with the County and the replacement of the Green Stigma-Free line was discussed. Councilwoman Balistreri ended her report by congratulating the Classes of 2019.

Councilwoman Wechtler shared that the next Homeowners Association meeting will be held on June 26th with DPW Superintendent being the guest speaker. They will be hosting two Sands Casino trips, one in June and one in July. She went on to share an update on the Library Hut which is expected to open by mid-July. Lastly, she congratulated the 2019 graduating students.

Councilman Fasolo shared congratulatory remarks for the Classes of 2019 and reported Progress.

Council President Pellegrine publicized takeaways from the most recent Board of Health meeting. More specifically, she shared that the County will be visiting the Borough to inform residents of free programs available through their office, including mosquito spraying, as a condition of their shared services agreement. The date is to be determined. She then disclosed that, as a result of the latest Chamber of Commerce meeting, Donna Spoto from the Division of Economic Development will be providing the Borough a link to place on their website that will direct residents to numerous beneficial resources. For her Police Department report she discussed the launched Street-Smart Campaign, LEAD graduation, Chief for a Day, and Junior Police Academy. In conclusion, Council President Pellegrine disclosed the next date for Council Corner as September 21st and congratulated the Classes of 2019.

Mayor Golabek informed the public of the change in the recent CDBG grant application due to a switch in eligible areas as per HUD. Additionally, he further went on to explain the resolution to appoint Monmouth Telecom as it would present a \$12,000 a year cost-savings for Borough phone lines. Mayor Golabek then announced that the Borough Newsletter should be complete and sent out by mid-July. He continued on by thanking the DPW for completing the parking stalls along Market Street, which saved the Borough money as it was done in-house, and for the newly installed yellow cut-outs in no parking zones as opposed to yellow curbs. Mayor Golabek then took the time to congratulate the Classes of 2019.

PUBLIC COMMENT

Kenneth Arabia, Locust Street, made the Council aware of an abandoned tire that was dumped near his home, behind the Borough parking lot. He then went on to question if the new parking lines would be implemented on Locust Street and raised concerns around parking on Locust Street

Jeanne Freitag, Hillman Drive, informed the Governing Body that the Generator fence is crooked and also inquired as to the cost of the cover. She followed up on the spraying of mosquito jungle and recycling bins suggestion at the DPW. In response, Ms. Freitag was informed that spraying

was done by the County and that DPW Superintendent Scott Karcz advised that he does not have the manpower or space to do so. She continued on to welcome back Library Director Bobbie Protono and inquired about the status of the tennis court project with the schools, in which it was shared that the Borough is currently in negotiations with contractors. Moving on, Ms. Freitag questioned whose responsibility broken curbs are to repair and stated that there are numerous individuals within the Borough that park at yellow curbs and do not get penalized. The Governing Body responded by advising Ms. Freitag that it is the homeowner's responsibility and that if she witnesses such an infraction that she should make the police department aware. She concluded her public comments by stating her concerns regarding public service equipment being left overnight and blocking roads which may make it hard for emergency vehicles to get through.

Jeffrey Freitag, Hillman Drive, reiterated that service vehicles, Sanzari in particular, are parking overnight and wherever they wish.

Kenneth Arabia, Locust Street, revealed that there is an issue with the patrons of Blue 42 and public urination in neighboring streets.

Christine Grezlak, Linwood Avenue, thanked the Mayor and Council for taking action in regards to the noise spilling over into Elmwood Park from Paterson's East Side Park and suggested that the Borough announce the opening of the Library Hut by taking out an ad in the newspaper.

A motion was made by Councilman Fasolo and seconded by Councilwoman Wechtler to adjourn. Motion carried unanimously.
