WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council have become aware of the necessity to regulate the particular intersection of Beech Street and Van Riper Avenue for safety concerns of traffic and pedestrian crossing, in order to protect the health, safety and welfare of the residents of the Borough of Elmwood Park.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Elmwood Park, County of Bergen, and State of New Jersey and pursuant to N.J.S.A. 39:4-140 of the laws of the state of New Jersey the Mayor and Council ordains as follows:

SECTION 1: That by way of this Ordinance the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Elmwood Park do hereby designate and establish a “One Stop” at Beech Street and Van Riper Avenue in the Borough of Elmwood Park.

SECTION 2: The designated “One Stop” is in the interest of the public and its health, safety and welfare and the inhabitants in and near said intersection.

SECTION 3: The responsible department of the Borough of Elmwood Park shall be responsible and directed through the Borough Administrator to install the necessary “One Stop” signs at the above-mentioned intersection.

SECTION 4: Be it further Ordained by the Mayor and Council that Chapter VII of the Code of the Borough of Elmwood Park titled "Traffic" more specifically section 7-20 titled “Stop Intersections” is hereby amended so as to include thereto the “One Stop” at Beech Street and Van Riper Avenue as follows:

7-21 MULTI-WAY STOP INTERSECTIONS.

Is hereby amended to include the “One Stop” intersection of Beech Street and Van Riper Avenue. That traffic will stop in the direction of Beech Street to Van Riper Avenue.

SECTION 5: Penalties for violation. Any person who violates the provision of this Ordinance shall, upon conviction thereof, be fined in accordance to the respective and appropriate fine sections of the Borough of Elmwood Park and or as set forth in the Laws of the State of New Jersey.

SECTION 6: The Police Chief and the Police Department of the Borough of Elmwood Park, shall assist and enforce the provisions of this Ordinance.

SECTION 7: Repealer. All Ordinances of the Borough of Elmwood Park to the extent that same are not inconsistent with this Ordinance shall remain in full force and effect until modified or repealed pursuant to law. All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed as to such inconsistencies.

SECTION 3: Invalid Provisions.: If any section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance is for any reason held to be unconstitutional or invalid, such decision shall not affect the remaining portions of this Ordinance.

BOND ORDINANCE TO APPROPRIATE AN ADDITIONAL SUM OF \$125,000 FOR THE REPLACEMENT OF THE WATER MAIN AT TUELLA AVENUE IN, BY AND FOR THE WATER UTILITY OF THE BOROUGH OF ELMWOOD PARK, IN THE COUNTY OF BERGEN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, TO AUTHORIZE THE ISSUANCE OF BONDS TO FINANCE SUCH ADDITIONAL APPROPRIATION AND TO PROVIDE FOR THE ISSUANCE OF BOND ANTICIPATION NOTES IN ANTICIPATION OF THE ISSUANCE OF SUCH BONDS.

WHEREAS, the Borough Council of the Borough of Elmwood Park has heretofore authorized the replacement of the water main at Tuella Avenue in, by and for the Water Utility of said Borough and appropriated \$1,050,000 therefor pursuant to bond ordinance no. 19-24 adopted by the Borough Council of said Borough on September 19, 2019; and

WHEREAS, the Borough Council now finds and determines that the additional sum of \$125,000 is required for such purpose, **NOW, THEREFORE**,

BE IT ORDAINED by the Borough Council of the Borough of Elmwood Park, in the County of Bergen, New Jersey (the "Borough"), as follows:

Section 1. The additional sum of \$125,000 is hereby appropriated to the payment of the cost of the improvement authorized by bond ordinance no. 19-24 adopted by the Borough Council of the Borough on September 19, 2019 (the "Prior Ordinance"). Said additional appropriation shall be met from the proceeds of the sale of the bonds authorized by this ordinance. No down payment is required for this bond ordinance pursuant to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 40A:2-11(c) and 40A:2-7(h). Said improvement has been and shall be made as a general improvement and no part of the cost thereof has been nor shall be assessed against property specially benefited.

Section 2. It is hereby determined and stated that (1) the making of such improvement (hereinafter referred to as "purpose") is not a current expense of said Borough, and (2) it is necessary to finance the additional cost of said purpose by the issuance of obligations of said Borough pursuant to the Local Bond Law (Chapter 2 of Title 40A of the New Jersey Statutes Annotated, as amended; the "Local Bond Law"), and (3) the estimated cost of said purpose is \$1,175,000, including the sum of \$1,050,000 appropriated by the Prior Ordinance and the \$125,000 appropriated by this ordinance, and (4) the estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes necessary to be issued for such purpose is \$1,175,000, including the \$1,050,000 authorized by the Prior Ordinance and the \$125,000 hereinafter authorized, and (5) the cost of such purpose includes the aggregate amount of \$275,000, including the sum of \$150,000 stated in the Prior Ordinance and the sum of \$125,000 hereby stated, which is estimated to be necessary to finance the cost of such purpose, including architect's fees, accounting, engineering and inspection costs, legal expenses and other expenses, including interest on such obligations to the extent permitted by Section 20 of the Local Bond Law.

Section 3. It is hereby determined and stated that the Water Utility would have been self-liquidating, as defined in Section 47(a) of the Local Bond Law, during the fiscal year beginning January 1, 2018, had there been included in the interest and debt redemption charges for such year an amount equal to interest for one year at the rate of four and one half percentum (4 1/2%) per annum on said bonds or notes, and the amount of the first installment of serial bonds legally issuable to finance such purpose plus an amount for charges as aforesaid with respect to all bonds and notes authorized but not issued for such Water Utility.

Section 4. To finance said purpose, bonds of said Borough of an aggregate principal amount not exceeding \$125,000 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to the Local Bond Law. Said bonds shall bear interest at a rate per annum as may be hereafter determined within the limitations prescribed by law. All matters with respect to said bonds not determined by this ordinance shall be determined by resolutions to be hereafter adopted.

Section 5. To finance said purpose, bond anticipation notes of said Borough of an aggregate principal amount not exceeding \$125,000 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to the Local Bond Law in anticipation of the issuance of said bonds. In the event that bonds are issued pursuant to this ordinance, the aggregate amount of notes hereby authorized to be issued shall be reduced by an amount equal to the principal amount of the bonds so issued. If the aggregate amount of outstanding bonds and notes issued pursuant to this ordinance shall at any time exceed the sum first mentioned in this section, the moneys raised by the issuance of said bonds shall, to not less than the amount of such excess, be applied to the payment of such notes then outstanding.

Section 6. Each bond anticipation note issued pursuant to this ordinance shall be dated on or about the date of its issuance and shall be payable not more than one year from its date, shall bear interest at a rate per annum as may be hereafter determined within the limitations prescribed by law and may be renewed from time to time pursuant to and within limitations prescribed by the Local Bond Law. Each of said notes shall be signed by the Mayor and by a financial officer and shall be under the seal of said Borough and attested by the Borough Clerk or Deputy Borough Clerk. Said officers are hereby authorized to execute said notes in such form as they may adopt in conformity with law. The power to determine any matters with respect to said notes not determined by this ordinance and also the power to sell said notes, is hereby delegated to the Chief Financial Officer who is hereby authorized to sell said notes either at one time or from time to time in the manner provided by law.

Section 7. It is hereby determined and declared that the period of usefulness of said purpose, according to its reasonable life, is a period of forty years computed from the date of said bonds.

Section 8. It is hereby determined and stated that the Supplemental Debt Statement required by the Local Bond Law has been duly made and filed in the office of the Borough Clerk of said Borough, and that such statement so filed shows that the gross debt of said Borough, as defined in Section 43 of the Local Bond Law, is increased by this ordinance by \$125,000, but said \$125,000 shall be deducted from gross debt pursuant to Section 44(c) of the Local Bond Law and that the issuance of the bonds and notes authorized by this ordinance is permitted by an exception to the debt limitations prescribed by the Local Bond Law as provided in Sections 47(a) and 7(h) of the Local Bond Law.

Section 9. Any funds received from private parties, the County of Bergen, the State of New Jersey or any of their agencies or any funds received from the United States of America or any of its agencies in aid of such purpose, shall be applied to the payment of the cost of such purpose, or, if bond anticipation notes have been issued, to the payment of the bond anticipation notes, and the amount of bonds authorized for such purpose shall be reduced accordingly.

Section 10. The Borough intends to issue the bonds or notes to finance the cost of the improvement authorized by the Prior Ordinance and described herein. If the Borough incurs such costs prior to the issuance of the bonds or notes, the Borough hereby states its reasonable expectation to reimburse itself for such expenditures with the proceeds of such bonds or notes in the maximum principal amount of bonds or notes authorized by this bond ordinance.

Section 11. The full faith and credit of the Borough are hereby pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and the interest on the obligations authorized by this ordinance. Said obligations shall be direct, unlimited and general obligations of the Borough, and the Borough shall levy ad valorem taxes upon all the taxable real property within the Borough for the payment of the principal of and interest on such bonds and notes, without limitation as to rate or amount.

Section 12. The capital budget is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency therewith and the resolutions promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing full detail of the amended capital budget and capital program as approved by the Director, Division of Local Government Services, is on file with the Borough Clerk and is available for public inspection.

WHEREAS, the Borough of Elmwood Park strongly believes in and supports open transparent government, and that citizens and residents have the right to be informed about the workings of government in order to best participate in a democracy; and

WHEREAS, on January 8, 2002 then Acting Governor DiFrancesco signed into law the Open Public Records Act (OPRA) which mandates that government records shall be available, with limited exceptions, for public access and simplifying the procedures for requesting such specific records; and

WHEREAS, the intent of the law was to provide the public with easy access to government records with an uncomplicated process for obtaining the records and eliminating bureaucratic red tape; and

WHEREAS, over the course of 18 years OPRA has been a positive light, but it has also been fraught with abuse and misuse, and has become an unanticipated financial cost to the taxpayers of New Jersey; and

WHEREAS, the Borough of Elmwood Park has labored under a well-intended law that has spiraled out of control, due to the volume and nature of requests, the cost to taxpayers in responding to the requests, and the potential liability in having to pay disproportionate prevailing party attorney's fees should the requests turn into litigated matters, as well as the liability in determining which documents shall be released, with or without redaction, while attempting to maintain individual privacy; and

WHEREAS, it is not only the volume of OPRA requests that challenge our resources, but it is also the cost associated with reviewing, retrieving, and processing the OPRA request(s) by public entity personnel and counsel and possibly defending our action(s) before the Government Records Council or in Superior Court; and

WHEREAS, the Borough of Elmwood Park received and responded to approximately 295 OPRA requests in 2018, and to date has received and responded to 340 OPRA requests as of November 12, 2019; and

WHEREAS, due to the often-conflicting case law and Government Record Council decisions, as well as the unique characteristics of OPRA request, the Borough of Elmwood Park must often times rely on the municipal attorney to review certain OPRA requests, resulting in additional fees; and

WHEREAS, with limited exceptions OPRA has not been amended to address the clear and apparent advancement in technology that has changed the way government records are created, stored, and/or transmitted; the various interpretive decisions; privacy concerns; abuse for commercial gain; and/or the ever-increasing cost to taxpayers; and

WHEREAS, as the current law approaches its twentieth (20th) anniversary it has outgrown its original intended use and has become ripe for comprehensive review and reform;

STATEMENT OF PURPOSE

WHEREAS, the Municipal Council of the Borough of Elmwood Park has determined that it is in the best interests of the Borough to investigate and determine whether the Borough of Elmwood Park in its entirety (the “delineated area”) meets the criteria of the Local Redevelopment and Housing Law (N.J.S.A. 40A:12A-1 et seq.) as an “Area in Need of Rehabilitation”; and

WHEREAS, the conditions that warrant a determination that an “Area in Need of Rehabilitation” should be evaluated under N.J.S.A. 40A:12A-14 as follows:

A. A delineated area may be determined to be in need of rehabilitation if the governing body of the municipality determines by resolution that a program of rehabilitation, as defined in section 3 of P.L.1992, c.79 (C.40A:12A-3), may be expected to prevent further deterioration and promote the overall development of the community; and there exist in that area conditions such that (1) a significant portion of structures therein are in a deteriorated or substandard condition; (2) more than half of the housing stock in the delineated area is at least 50 years old; (3) there is a pattern of vacancy, abandonment or underutilization of properties in the area; (4) there is a persistent arrearage of property tax payments on properties in the areas; (5) environmental contamination is discouraging improvements and investment in properties in the area; or (6) a majority of the water and sewer infrastructure in the delineated area is at least 50 years old and is in need of repair or substantial maintenance. Where warranted by consideration of the overall conditions and requirements of the community, a finding of need for rehabilitation may extend to the entire area of a municipality. Prior to adoption of the resolution, the governing body shall submit it to the municipal planning board for its review. Within 45 days of its receipt of the proposed resolution, the municipal planning board shall submit its recommendations regarding the proposed resolution, including any modifications which it may recommend, to the governing body for its consideration. Thereafter, or after the expiration of the 45 days if the municipal planning board does not submit recommendations, the governing body may adopt the resolution, with or without modification. The resolution shall not become effective without the approval of the Commissioner of the Department of Community Affairs for the State of New Jersey pursuant to section 6 of P.L.1992, c.79 (C.40A:12A-6), if otherwise required pursuant to that section.

B. A delineated area shall be deemed to have been determined to be an area in need of rehabilitation in accordance with the provisions of this act if it has heretofore been determined to be an area in need rehabilitation pursuant to P.L.1975, c.104 (C.54:4-3.72 et seq.), P.L.1977, c.12 (C.54:4-3.95 et seq.) or P.L.1979, c.233 (C.54:4-3.121 et seq.).

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Municipal Council of the Borough of Elmwood Park, New Jersey, that:

Section 1. Pursuant to the Local Redevelopment and Housing Law (N.J.S.A. 40A:12A-14), the Elmwood Park Planning Board is directed to review the attached resolution designating the entire Borough as an “Area in Need of Rehabilitation”, the attached memorandum dated October 29, 2019 and prepared by Topology NJ, LLC, planning consulting firm to the Borough, and to provide its recommendation on whether the conditions that warrant designating the Borough of Elmwood Park in its entirety as an “Area In Need of Rehabilitation” and shall be returned to the Municipal Council for consideration of adoption, with or without modification within 45 days.

Section 2. Upon a determination by the Municipal Council of the Borough of Elmwood Park that the Borough in its entirety is an “Area in Need of Rehabilitation” pursuant to Section 14 of the Local Redevelopment and Housing Law (N.J.S.A. 40A:12A-1 et seq.), that this resolution shall then be forwarded for approval to the Commissioner of the Department of Community Affairs for the State of New Jersey before this resolution shall become effective.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Councilman Fasolo stated that the Class of 2020 Fundraiser had a good turnout and that the Board of Education's next meeting is scheduled for November 26th. He then thanked the Police Chief and PBA for putting the Halloween "Trunk or Treat" together at the last minute due to the inclement weather. Continuing on with his report, Councilman Fasolo acknowledged Councilwoman Ingui's good thinking for suggesting the Elm and Washington four-way stop. He ended by extending his Congratulations to Mr. Colletti, Mr. Golabek, and Ms. Delaney

Councilwoman Wechtler, again, congratulated Ms. Delaney on her appointment. For her Homeowner's Association report, Ms. Wechtler stated that there would be no meetings held in November and December but that the Bus Fundraising trips will continue with the next one to take place on November 22nd. Their Christmas party is scheduled for December 10th. Lastly, Councilwoman Wechtler announced that the next Library Board meeting is November 18th and that the library is expected to open in January.
