1. CALL TO ORDER:

The Regular Meeting of the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Elmwood Park was called to order on Thursday, June 18, 2020 at 7:01PM in the Council Chambers of the Municipal Building, 182 Market Street, Elmwood Park, New Jersey.

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CHAPTER 2 "ADMINISTRATION" MORE SPECIFICALLY ARTICLE III OF THE CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF ELMWOOD PARK TITLED "DEPARTMENT OF THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT." MORE SPECIFICALLY, SECTION 2-27 ENTITLED "POLICE DEPARTMENT." MORE SPECIFICALLY SECTION 2-27.1 ENTITLED "CREATION OF THE DEPARTMENT; MEMBERS"

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council have become aware of the need to streamline the police department to make the same more efficient in its operation and to protect the health and safety of the residents of the Borough of Elmwood Park.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Elmwood Park, County of Bergen, and State of New Jersey as follows:

SECTION 1: Chapter 2, Article III of the Code of the Borough of Elmwood Park titled "Department of Local Government" more specifically section 2-27.1 Creation of the Department; Members.

Section a. 2. Shall be amended to read Three (3) Captains, automatically reducing to Two (2) Captains immediately upon the retirement of the Senior Captain in 2021. All of the remaining portions of said section shall remain in full force and effect.

Section a. 4. Shall be amended to read Six (6), Sergeants. All of the remaining portions of said section shall remain in full force and effect.

Section a. 5. Shall be amended to read Thirty-Three (33), Patrol Officers. All of the remaining portions of said section shall remain in full force and effect.

All of the remaining parts of the Ordinance relating to Article III, known as Department of the Local Government of the Borough of Elmwood Park to the extent that they are not inconsistent with this Ordinance shall remain in full force and effect until modified or repealed pursuant to law. All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed as to such inconsistencies.

SECTION 3: Invalid Provisions

If any section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance is for any reason held to be unconstitutional or invalid, such decision shall not affect the remaining portions of this Ordinance.

SECTION 4: Effective Date.

This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon final passage and publication thereof as provided by law.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF ELMWOOD PARK IN THE COUNTY OF BERGEN AND STATE OF NEW JERSEY AMENDING CHAPTER 14 ENTITLED “FIRE PREVENTION”, MORE SPECIFICALLY SECTION 14-1.8 ENTITLED “NON-LIFE HAZARD USES” BY AMENDING AND ADDING CERTAIN LANGUAGE CONTAINED AND A NEW USE TO THAT SECTION WITH THE PROPOSED LANGUAGE AND USE AS FOLLOWS

WHEREAS, Pursuant to the provisions as set forth under the laws of the State of New Jersey which grants the right to a municipality to set up standards and regulations relating to the health, safety and welfare of its residents and maintain proper and safe sanitary conditions within the municipality; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and the Borough Council of the Borough of Elmwood Park, County of Bergen, State of New Jersey has reviewed, considered the recommendations of the Fire Inspector, Building Department and the Business Administrator having determined that there is a need to amend section 14-1.8(a) to include a new use classification to be identified as R-SU and further add therein a new paragraph which will be identified as (g) which will read “Any and all residential uses that are registered and or licensed by any other agency not otherwise classified shall also be registered with fire prevention and be inspected on a regular basis. These uses shall be classified and registered as an R-SU use and pay an annual registration fee of \$75.00” for the overall safety, health and welfare of the citizens and residents of the Borough; and

WHEREAS, upon the advice and recommendation of the Fire Inspector, Borough’s building department and Borough Business Administrator, the Mayor and the Borough Council of the Borough of Elmwood Park find that it is necessary to update 14-1.8 of the Code in order to bring same up to present standards so as to assist the Borough in alleviating potential health and safety condition.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Borough Council of the Borough of Elmwood Park in the County of Bergen and State of New Jersey that Section 14-1.8 intitled “Non-Life Hazard Uses” more specifically paragraph (a) be and is hereby amended to include in the existing chart the following new classification:

Use:	Description:	Fee:
R-SU	Any and all uses registered/licensed by other agency not classified	75.00

And a new designated paragraph to read as follows:

g. Any and all residential uses that are registered and or licensed by any other agency not otherwise classified shall also be registered with fire prevention and be inspected on a regular basis. These uses shall be classified and registered as an R-SU use and pay an annual registration fee of \$75.

All of the existing language in said section will remain unchanged and enforceable as setforth therein.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that if for any reason, any section or provision of this Ordinance shall be held to be unconstitutional or invalid by any Court, the same shall not affect any other section or provision of this Ordinance, except so far as the section or provision so declared unconstitutional or invalid shall be severed from the remainder or any portion thereof.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, all ordinances or parts thereof, which are inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance, are hereby repealed to the extent of their inconsistencies.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, this Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its final passage and publication as required and in accordance with the law.

SECTION VII: VACATION

1. All full-time employees shall be allowed vacation leave from their employment with continuance of compensation provided herein, in accordance with the following schedule:

AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF ELMWOOD PARK, COUNTY OF BERGEN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, AMENDING AND SUPPLEMENTING THE CODE OF THE BOROUGH CHAPTER XXII, ENTITLED "STREETS AND SIDEWALKS," MORE SPECIFICALLY SECTION 22-3 ENTITLED "CURBS AND SIDEWALKS" MORE SPECIFICALLY SUBSECTION 22-3.2 ENTITLED "MAINTENANCE AND REPAIRS" SO AS TO INCLUDE CERTAIN LANGUAGE CLARIFYING THE OBLIGATION AND RESPONSIBILITY SETFORTH THEREIN UNDER CERTAIN SPECIAL CIRCUMSTANCES

INTENT OF THIS ORDINANCE

The intent of this Ordinance is to amend the part of the ordinance, to allow the Borough to undertake responsibility of repairing and or replacing deteriorating street curbs under certain circumstance. Thereby limiting the property owner's obligation, under those specific circumstances, of maintaining and repairing said street curbs.

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council have become aware of health and safety concerns that exist with regards to the conditions of many of the Boroughs street curbs, and in order to protect the health and safety of the residents of the Borough of Elmwood Park and also extending assistance to the residents and owners of properties; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Elmwood Park have concluded and determined that the disrepair and deteriorating conditions of certain street curbs are and have become a hazard to the health, safety and the welfare of the public; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council have further recognized that under certain circumstances it would be an unreasonable financial burden to place the obligation upon the particular property owner to be responsible for the repair or replacement of any such street curbs and in order to divert and assist the particular property owners and lessen this financial burden

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Elmwood Park, County of Bergen, and State of New Jersey as follows:

SECTION 1: Chapter XXII of the Code of the Borough of Elmwood Park entitled "Streets and Sidewalks" more specifically section 22-3 entitled "Curbs and Sidewalks" more specifically sub-section 22-3.2 entitled "Maintenance and Repairs" is hereby amended to contain the following language:

"Upon the following events, and solely upon such events:

- A. When the Borough has or will undertake the obligation to fully repave any roadway in the Borough curb to curb; and/or
- B. When a Borough owned road or any part thereof is to be paved or will be paved, curb to curb, by any other entity, or
- C. When a particular project is approved, and bidding has been awarded and work has begun or will begin;

The curbs in that roadway and/or portion of that roadway being or which will be paved, curb to curb, shall be evaluated by the Borough Engineer and/or the DPW Superintendent.

The Borough Engineer and/or the DPW Superintendent, shall determine if a curb or any span or portion thereof should be replaced. Upon such determination, the Borough Engineer and/or the DPW Superintendent, shall advise the Borough Council and Mayor of this recommendation for approval for any repair and/or replacement of such curb or part thereof and the Borough Council shall consider such recommendation and shall have final determination and final approval for same.

In determining the replacement or the need thereof, the Borough Engineer and/or the DPW Superintendent shall consider the following criteria:

1. The curb should be replaced, if upon the discretion of the Borough engineer and/or the DPW Superintendent, it is determined that a 30% or more of the exposed curb is missing, or as recommended by the council; and/or
2. The curb should be replaced if, upon observation of the Borough engineer and/or the DPW Superintendent, it can be observed solely, by visual inspection, that the span is not fixed in place or can be observed to be movable due to the separation from, or lack thereof, subsurface curb to hold the curb in place throughout the duration of the improvements to the roadway in question: and/or
3. The curb should be replaced if it does not meet certain building code requirements which will be determined and recommended by the Borough Building Inspector: and/or
4. The curb should be replaced if, at the recommendation of the Borough Engineer and/or the DPW Superintendent, the integrity of the curb or span of curb is compromised where it can be anticipated that it may or will break up or will be damaged in the milling process: and/or
5. The curb should be replaced if 30% or more of the exposed curb or any portion thereof is not properly attached to the remainder of the span whereas a span of curb is designated to be non-monolithic and fully separated from the sidewalk, roadway, and any other span of curb. However, this 30% is a mere guide and is not a fixed or a requirement but it is stated solely for a guide to logically set a minimal point reference when the curb should need to be replaced.

At all times, notwithstanding the language in this ordinance, or any other language contained in the Borough Code to the contrary, it will remain the discretion of the Mayor and Council to determine after advice of the Borough engineer and/or the DPW Superintendent whether or not any particular curbing should be replaced.

Upon the above replacement and repaving criteria and condition, the property owners adjacent to the said roadway in which the Borough and/ or other entity replaces the curbs based upon the above will not be responsible for the costs of the replacement of curb. However, the property owners will continue to be responsible for said curb in the future as setforth in this prior section of the ordinance.”

SECTION 2. In the event any section, part or provision of this Ordinance shall be held unconstitutional or invalid by any Court, such holding shall not affect the validity of this Ordinance or any remaining part of this Ordinance other than the part held unconstitutional or invalid.

SECTION 3. All ordinances or parts thereof, which are inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance, are hereby repealed to the extent of their inconsistencies.

SECTION 4. This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its final passage and publication as required by law.

COST THEREOF, TO MAKE A DOWN PAYMENT, TO AUTHORIZE
THE ISSUANCE OF BONDS TO FINANCE SUCH APPROPRIATION
AND TO PROVIDE FOR THE ISSUANCE OF BOND ANTICIPATION
NOTES IN ANTICIPATION OF THE ISSUANCE OF SUCH BONDS.**

BE IT ORDAINED by the Borough Council of the Borough of Elmwood Park, in the County of Bergen, State of New Jersey, as follows:

Section 1. The Borough of Elmwood Park, in the County of Bergen, State of New Jersey (the "Borough") is hereby authorized to undertake the improvement of Donor Avenue (from Elmwood Terrace to Glenwood Avenue) and Echo Place, including road resurfacing, construction of ADA compliant sidewalk ramps and drainage, curb and sidewalk improvements, where necessary, in, by and for the Borough. Said improvements shall include all work, materials and appurtenances necessary and suitable therefor. It is hereby determined and stated that said roads being improved are of "Class B" or equivalent construction as defined in Section 22 of the Local Bond Law (Chapter 2 of Title 40A of the New Jersey Statutes Annotated, as amended; the "Local Bond Law").

Section 2. The sum of \$305,000 is hereby appropriated to the payment of the cost of making the improvements described in Section 1 hereof (hereinafter referred to as "purpose"). Said appropriation shall be met from the proceeds of the sale of the bonds authorized and the down payment appropriated by this ordinance. It is anticipated that a grant from the Bergen County Community Development Program, pursuant to the Federal Housing and Community Development Act, shall be received by the Borough to finance the cost of the improvements described in Section 1 hereof. Any of said grant funds so received shall be applied as set forth in Section 10 hereof. Said improvements shall be made as general improvements and no part of the cost thereof shall be assessed against property specially benefited.

Section 3. It is hereby determined and stated that (1) the making of such improvements is not a current expense of said Borough, and (2) it is necessary to finance said purpose by the issuance of obligations of said Borough pursuant to the Local Bond Law, and (3) the estimated cost of said purpose is \$305,000, and (4) \$15,000 of said sum is to be provided by the down payment hereinafter appropriated to finance said purpose, and (5) the estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes necessary to be issued for said purpose is \$290,000, and (6) the cost of such purpose, as hereinbefore stated, includes the aggregate amount of \$45,000 which is estimated to be necessary to finance the cost of such purpose, including architect's fees, accounting, engineering and inspection costs, legal expenses and other expenses, including interest on such obligations to the extent permitted by Section 20 of the Local Bond Law.

Section 4. It is hereby determined and stated that moneys exceeding \$15,000, appropriated for down payments on capital improvements or for the capital improvement fund in budgets heretofore adopted for said Borough, are now available to finance said purpose. The sum of \$15,000 is hereby appropriated from such moneys to the payment of the cost of said purpose.

Section 5. To finance said purpose, bonds of said Borough of an aggregate principal amount not exceeding \$290,000 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to the Local Bond Law. Said bonds shall bear interest at a rate per annum as may be hereafter determined within the limitations prescribed by law. All matters with respect to said bonds not determined by this ordinance shall be determined by resolutions to be hereafter adopted.

Section 6. To finance said purpose, bond anticipation notes of said Borough of an aggregate principal amount not exceeding \$290,000 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to the Local Bond Law in anticipation of the issuance of said bonds. In the event that bonds are issued pursuant to this ordinance, the aggregate amount of notes hereby authorized to be issued shall be reduced by an amount equal to the principal amount of the bonds so issued. If the aggregate amount of outstanding bonds and notes issued pursuant to this ordinance shall at any time exceed the sum first mentioned in this section, the moneys raised by the issuance of said bonds shall, to not less than the amount of such excess, be applied to the payment of such notes then outstanding.

Section 7. Each bond anticipation note issued pursuant to this ordinance shall be dated on or about the date of its issuance and shall be payable not more than one year from its date, shall bear interest at a rate per annum as may be hereafter determined within the limitations prescribed by law and may be renewed from time to time pursuant to and within limitations prescribed by the Local Bond Law. Each of said notes shall be signed by the Mayor and by a financial officer and shall be under the seal of said Borough and attested by the Borough Clerk or Deputy Borough Clerk. Said officers are hereby authorized to execute said notes and to issue said notes in such form as they may adopt in conformity with law. The power to determine any matters with respect to said notes not determined by this ordinance and also the power to sell said notes, is hereby delegated to the Chief Financial Officer, who is hereby authorized to sell said notes either at one time or from time to time in the manner provided by law.

Section 8. It is hereby determined and declared that the period of usefulness of said purpose, according to its reasonable life, is a period of ten years computed from the date of said bonds.

Section 9. It is hereby determined and stated that the Supplemental Debt Statement required by the Local Bond Law has been duly made and filed in the office of the Borough Clerk of said Borough, and that such statement so filed shows that the gross debt of said Borough, as defined in Section 43 of the Local Bond Law, is increased by this ordinance by \$290,000 and that the issuance of the bonds and notes authorized by this ordinance will be within all debt limitations prescribed by said Local Bond Law.

Section 10. Any funds received from private parties, the County of Bergen, the State of New Jersey or any of their agencies or any funds received from the United States of America or any of its agencies in aid of such purpose, shall be applied to the payment of the cost of such purpose, or, if bond anticipation notes have been issued, to the payment of the bond anticipation notes, and the amount of bonds authorized for such purpose shall be reduced accordingly.

Section 11. The capital budget is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency therewith and the resolutions promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing full detail of the amended capital budget and capital program as approved by the Director, Division of Local Government Services, is on file with the Borough Clerk and is available for public inspection.

Section 12. The Borough intends to issue the bonds or notes to finance the cost of the improvements described in Section 1 of this bond ordinance. If the Borough incurs such costs prior to the issuance of the bonds or notes, the Borough hereby states its reasonable expectation to reimburse itself for such expenditures with the proceeds of such bonds or notes in the maximum principal amount of bonds or notes authorized by this bond ordinance.

Section 13. The full faith and credit of the Borough are hereby pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and the interest on the obligations authorized by this ordinance. Said obligations shall be direct, unlimited and general obligations of the Borough, and the Borough shall levy ad valorem taxes upon all the taxable real property within the Borough for the payment of the principal of and interest on such bonds and notes, without limitation as to rate or amount.

Section 14. This ordinance shall take effect twenty days after the first publication thereof after final passage.

INTENT OF THE RESOLUTION

The Mayor and Council, of the Borough of Elmwood Park, in supporting small businesses and advancing public health. Have recognized the burden, which the local food business has sustained, as a result of this COVID-19 pandemic. The Mayor and the Borough Council have determined that the local businesses and the residents of the Borough would benefit from allowing the temporary sidewalk and outdoor seating for restaurants (with social distancing protocols) and curbside sales for retail businesses. The Mayor and Council have determined that this is needed and required at this time.

WHEREAS, Governor Murphy issued the Emergency Order in response to the COVID-19 pandemic, requiring nonessential businesses to close and limiting restaurant operations to carry out only; and these necessary health restrictions have had severe negative economic impacts to businesses, residents and local jurisdictions; and

WHEREAS, The Mayor and Council of the Borough of Elmwood Park acknowledging that by Executive Order No. 150 (2020), Governor Murphy announced that, given the reduced Transmission of COVID-19 outdoors, licensees or permittees with on-premises retail consumption privileges would be permitted to reopen their establishments; and

WHEREAS, with authority granted by Governor Murphy allowing jurisdictions to move to Phase 2 Reopening, on June 15, 2020, the New Jersey Department of Health and the New Jersey Division of Alcoholic Beverage Control have also acted to move the State into Phase 2 Reopening status, June 15, 2020; and

WHEREAS, among several provisions, Phase 2 will allow some outdoor seating for restaurants (with social distancing protocols) and curbside sales for retail businesses; and

WHEREAS, businesses in Elmwood Park that will be allowed under Phase 2 to have outdoor seating or curbside sales are situated differently across the Borough; some have space on their property for outdoor seating, some have easy access to a wide sidewalk or curb space; others have very little space or access; some sidewalks and vehicular areas are on private property (such as in shopping centers), and some are in the public right of way space (Borough streets and sidewalks); and

WHEREAS, surrounding areas in Bergen County and the State of New Jersey are taking steps to modify the use of public space and to close travel lanes on streets; and

WHEREAS, in Elmwood Park, there is interest in facilitating the use of public and private outdoor space to allow for business use while ensuring that health protocols and accessibility, especially for residents with limited mobility, are protected, and negative impacts such as unsafe traffic in adjacent neighborhoods and other negative impacts on others are minimized; and

WHEREAS, closure of travel lanes, shared use of sidewalks and repurposing parking spaces are the primary actions that can be taken to provide the outdoor space for dining and curbside pickup; and

WHEREAS, closure of or partial closure of some Avenues, Streets, Lane could allow for space for outdoor dining and curbside pickup; and

WHEREAS, certain sidewalk areas, parking lots, parking spaces or curbside areas outside of a travel lane can also provide space for dining and curbside dining and pickup; and

WHEREAS, support for outdoor areas set aside for dining and curbside pickup on private property should also be encouraged to support the business community and provide safer dining options; and

WHEREAS, Borough staff can work with businesses, business associations and other entities to layout the spaces for outdoor dining and curbside pickup, while protecting pedestrian safety and accessibility, and make necessary changes to traffic patterns to ensure public safety; and

WHEREAS, Borough staff can work with neighborhood associations, local organizations, residents, and other entities to identify and implement measures on effective and adjacent streets to provide traffic, bike, and pedestrian safety; and

WHEREAS, changes to the public space need to benefit both the business community, as well as residents and create spaces for people to safely shop, eat, and enjoy the outside while continuing to protect public health and follow CDC guidelines; and

WHEREAS, it is expected that the design of the outdoor spaces and traffic mitigation and routing may change as safer or more effective arrangements are identified and as changed Emergency Orders are issued as a result of improving or worsening health data; and

WHEREAS, given the changing situation during the COVID-19 pandemic and the need to react quickly to impacts created by temporary changes to public space in the Borough and surrounding areas, the Borough Administrator requests Council approval to move forward with identifying and implementing a temporary modification to the existing uses of public space including sidewalks, roads, on-street parking, and parking lots for outdoor dining and curbside pickup to assist Elmwood Park's businesses, employees and residents during the COVID-19 pandemic;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Mayor and Borough Council of Elmwood Park supports temporarily modifying existing uses of public space including sidewalks, roads, on-street parking, and parking lots for outdoor dining and enjoyment, curbside pickup and other public uses to assist Elmwood Park's businesses, employees, and residents during the COVID-19 pandemic, provided such changes can be implemented in ways that maintain appropriate social distancing requirements, allow for accessible and safe sidewalk and business access for all residents, and are consistent with County and other public health guidelines aimed at reducing the spread of COVID-19; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Mayor and Borough Council directs the Borough Administrator to work with key entities including residents, neighborhood associations, businesses, business associations, and landlords to identify and implement temporary changes such as modifications to the use of sidewalks, on-street parking and parking lots for curbside pickup for restaurants and other businesses, and outdoor dining, and other public uses to assist Elmwood Park's businesses, employees, and residents during the COVID-19 pandemic, as well as temporary changes such as installing directional signage, barriers, and traffic mitigation measures to address and ensure public health, pedestrian safety and accessibility with special attention given to the needs of people with disabilities, and parking and vehicle safety including safe operation of vehicles in adjacent neighborhoods; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Mayor and the Borough Council authorize the partial closing of certain Avenues, Street, Lanes and parking lots that the Borough Administrator in his discretion finds reasonable and necessary in order to promote for outdoor dining and enjoyment, curbside pickup and other public use consistent with County and State guidelines if such closings are determined to be beneficial in creating safe spaces while protecting public health during the COVID-19 pandemic, and providing for pedestrian, bicycle, and automobile safety and safe operation of vehicles in neighborhood streets; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Borough Administrator will work to ensure that public health and safety, pedestrian accessibility, traffic safety, and noise affecting residential areas are addressed in the design of the outdoor dining and enjoyment, curbside pickup, and other public use plans, and will make modifications on an ongoing basis as needed to ensure that these factors are appropriately addressed as reopening continues and as there are changes to public health guidelines in the pandemic; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Borough Administrator will report back to Council within 30 days of the date of enactment of this Resolution and periodically thereafter on temporary actions taken under this Resolution, including by providing to the extent possible data on business, traffic and parking activity; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Borough Administrator and all Borough officials shall utilize the attached rules and regulation, that are attached to this resolution and are made part hereof, as a base and that the Borough Administrator with the assistance of the Borough Attorney shall have the authority to institute and adopt any and other rules and regulation in order to fulfill the intent of this Resolution; and

INTRODUCTION

The Mayor and Council, of the Borough of Elmwood Park, in supporting small businesses and advancing public health. Have recognized the burden, which the local food business has sustained, as a result of this COVID-19 pandemic. The Mayor and the Borough Council have determined that the local businesses and the residents of the borough would benefit from the temporary relaxation of certain sections of the borough's code. The Mayor and the Council have determined that the relaxation of specific requirements is required.

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Elmwood Park acknowledging that by Executive Order No. 150 (2020), Governor Murphy announced that, given the reduced Transmission of COVID-19 outdoors, licensees or permittees with on-premises retail consumption privileges would be permitted to re-open their establishments; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council have been made aware that individual sections of the Borough Code would hinder and would not promote the intent of the Executive Order of the Governor; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council wish to encourage and help the local business to re-open and be able to maximize their opportunity to re-establish themselves.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY the Mayor and Council that Chapter 4, entitled "licensing and business regulation" more specifically section 4-12 entitled "food handlers, mobile" more specifically section 4-12.6 entitled "prohibited acts; certificate of occupancy" more specifically paragraph (a)(3), is suspended conditioned upon allow the use of a food truck to stand on a public roadway or right of way and conditioned on showing sufficient proof that the food truck is owned or operated by an owner or a licensee of a permanent food establishment. That, the operation of the food truck is within a reasonable distance of that permanent establishment, at the discretion of the Business Administrator/Chief of Police and any other Borough Official. Also, relax the time to engage in the business all at the discretion of the Business Administrator/Chief of Police and any other Borough Officials.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, by the Mayor and Council that Section 4-12.16 entitled "location" more specifically paragraph (b) should and is hereby suspended for the purpose so as to allow any food truck operation to remain in a particular location, on a first-come basis for an extended time and not be limited by a 30-minute time limit.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, by the Mayor and Council, that this suspension is temporary and will expire at the end of November 2020 at which time, and in the interim, the Mayor and Council will reconsider this resolution and take all steps to address the matter for the future.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, by the Mayor and Council, that the Borough Business Administrator/Chief of Police will oversee the enforcement of this resolution and all power and discretion are afforded to the Business Administrator/Chief of Police and to all Borough officials to use all of their discretion and authority to assure full compliance with this resolution.
