**CALENDAR YEAR 2023 ORDINANCE TO EXCEED THE MUNICIPAL BUDGET
APPROPRIATION LIMITS AND TO ESTABLISH A CAP BANK (N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.14)**

WHEREAS, the Local Government Cap Law, N.J.S. 40A: 4-45.1 et seq., provides that in the preparation of its annual budget, a municipality shall limit any increase in said budget to 2.50% unless authorized by ordinance to increase it to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, subject to certain exceptions; and

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.15a provides that a municipality may, when authorized by ordinance, appropriate the difference between the amount of its actual final appropriation and the 3.5% percentage rate as an exception to its final appropriations in either of the next two succeeding years; and

WHEREAS, the Borough Council of the Borough of Elmwood Park in the County of Bergen finds it advisable and necessary to increase its CY 2023 budget by up to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, in the interest of promoting the health, safety and welfare of the citizens; and

WHEREAS, the Borough Council hereby determines that a 1.0% increase in the budget for said year, amounting to \$230,730.89 in excess of the increase in final appropriations otherwise permitted by the Local Government Cap Law, is advisable and necessary; and

WHEREAS the Borough Council hereby determines that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED, by the Borough Council of the Borough of Elmwood Park, in the County of Bergen, a majority of the full authorized membership of this governing body affirmatively concurring, that, in the CY 2023 budget year, the final appropriations of the Borough of Elmwood Park shall, in accordance with this ordinance and N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.14, be increased by 3.5%, amounting to \$838,160.12 and that the CY 2023 municipal budget for the Borough of Elmwood Park be approved and adopted in accordance with this ordinance; and

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that any that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years; and

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that a certified copy of this ordinance as introduced be filed with the Director of the Division of Local Government Services within 5 days of introduction; and

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that a certified copy of this ordinance upon adoption, with the recorded vote included thereon, be filed with said Director within 5 days after such adoption.

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Elmwood Park wish to amend Chapter 10, entitled “Construction and Buildings,” so as to modify Section 10-1.3, entitled “Fees”;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Elmwood Park that Chapter 10 of the Code of the Borough of Elmwood Park entitled “Construction and Buildings,” more specifically section 10-1.3 entitled Fees shall be amended by adding and deleting the following:

**DELETIONS SHALL BE ~~STRIKEOUT~~
ADDITIONS SHALL BE BOLDED**

Chapter 10 shall be replaced by the following:

10-1.3. Fees.

- a. The fee for a construction permit shall be the sum of the subcode fees listed below and shall be paid before the permit is issued. All fees will be rounded to the nearest dollar.

1. The Building Subcode fees shall be:

A. The building subcode fees shall be:

- (1) For new construction, ~~\$0.048~~ **\$0.051** per cubic foot of building or structure volume, provided that the minimum fee shall be:
- (a) Principal building: ~~\$500~~ **\$600**
- (b) Accessory building: ~~\$200~~ **\$300**
- (d) Swimming pool shall be a flat fee:
- [1] In-ground pool: ~~\$275~~ **\$350**, which shall include the required fence
- [2] Aboveground pool: ~~\$125~~ **\$175**, which shall include the required fence
- (e) Fences in excess of 6 feet in height or pool protection fence: ~~\$22~~ **\$50** per \$1,000 with a minimum fee of ~~\$80~~ **\$100**
- (2) For renovations, alterations, and repairs:
- (a) ~~\$25~~ **\$35** for each \$1,000 or part thereof estimated to cost up to \$50,000, provided that the minimum fee shall be ~~\$75~~ **\$85**
- (b) ~~\$21~~ **\$25** for each \$1,000 or part thereof, estimated cost from \$50,001 and up

1. Adoption of Redevelopment Plan.

3. Redevelopment Entity

WHEREAS, the governing body of the Borough of Elmwood Park, by ordinance, had adopted and has appointed one or more chaplains to the Police Department or force pursuant to **N.J.S.A. 40A:14-141**; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council have determined that a need has arisen to clarify further and redefine the position(s) of a chaplain(s) in the Police Department.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Elmwood Park, County of Bergen, and State of New Jersey as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 2-27.27 D is hereby amended and replaced with the following language:

D.1 Authority.

- a. The office of the Chaplain is to be of service to the Chief of Police, officers, patrolmen, their families, and the residents of the Borough of Elmwood Park.
- b. The Chaplain is a staff assistant to the Chief and may be consulted for any purpose by the Chief or supervisory people. It is understood that all communications with the Chaplain, whether of a personal or professional nature by members of the Police Department, will be held in confidence.
- c. The Chaplain shall be a sworn officer of the Police Department of the Borough of Elmwood Park but is foremost a duly ordained minister and an experienced representative of his or her denomination. It shall be the responsibility of the Police Department to provide the Chaplain with necessary insurance, uniforms, and equipment.
- d. The Chaplain is considered a staff assistant to the Chief of Police and is authorized to act in his name where the presence of police officers requires the assistance of the Chaplain. When on duty, the Chaplain shall be properly distinguished by his insignia and identification and shall conduct himself in a manner becoming his role and denomination.

D.2 Duties and responsibilities.

A. The Chaplain is requested to perform the following duties and such other duties that the Chief of Police may request:

1. Assist Police Department officials in informing families receiving serious injury or death.
2. When an officer is seriously injured or killed on duty, respond to the hospital on request and work with the hospital staff and hospital chaplain according to standard and ethical courtesies.
3. Visit sick or injured police personnel at home or in the hospital.
4. Attend and participate in funerals of active and retired members of the Police Department.
5. Counsel officers with personal problems.
6. Conduct memorial services.
7. Participate in in-service training programs.
8. Attend departmental graduations, promotions, award ceremonies, and other invocations and benedictions.
9. Assist in programs and plans for youthful offenders.

10. Assist in improving public relations.
 11. Notify, as soon as possible, an involved person's clergyman in case of a death or serious accident.
 12. Make proper referrals in unique cases which need specialized attention.
- B. The Chaplain shall also produce monthly reports detailing his activities and a yearly report to be submitted to the Chief of Police, the Mayor, and the Borough Council.
- C. The Chaplain should meet on a regular basis with the Chief of Police and superior officers for the purpose of ongoing evaluation, developing programs, and discussion of departmental morale.

D.3 Regulations and procedure.

A. The Chaplain should have a working knowledge of the duties of law enforcement officers shall, keep abreast of new procedures, and be willing to attend training sessions and programs. In addition, the Chaplain shall comply with the following procedures:

1. The Chaplain shall conform to all police procedures and department regulations insofar as applicable.
2. The Chaplain shall be on a telephone call with the Chief of Police, Department members, and dispatchers.
3. The Chaplain shall not publicly comment on any law enforcement officer, department official, or department policy or action.
4. The Chaplain shall not release any information to the public without the approval of the Chief of Police and the person or officers involved.

SECTION 2. In the event any section, part, or provision of this Ordinance shall be held unconstitutional or invalid by any Court, such holding shall not affect the validity of this Ordinance, or any remaining part of this Ordinance other than the part held unconstitutional or invalid.

SECTION 3. All ordinances or parts thereof, which are inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance, are hereby repealed to the extent of their inconsistencies.

SECTION 4. This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its final passage and publication as required by law.

SECTION 4. The remaining section of the ordinance will remain unchanged only to the degree that such is inconsistent with the change made hereto that will supersede.

WHEREAS, the Borough Council of the Borough of Elmwood Park has heretofore authorized the undertaking of streetscape improvements to Mola Boulevard (from Linden Avenue to Philip Avenue) in, by and for the Borough and appropriated the sum of \$510,000 therefor pursuant to Ordinance No. 22-27 adopted by the Borough Council of said Borough on November 10, 2022; and

It is anticipated that a \$239,000 grant from the New Jersey Department of Transportation shall be received by the Borough to finance the cost of the improvement authorized by the Prior Ordinance. Said grant funds shall be applied as set forth in Section 9 of the Prior Ordinance or Section 8 hereof. Said improvement has been and shall be made as a general improvement and no part of the cost thereof has been nor shall be assessed against property specially benefited.

Section 2. It is hereby determined and stated that (1) the making of such improvement (hereinafter referred to as "purpose") is not a current expense of said Borough, and (2) it is necessary to finance said purpose by the issuance of obligations of said Borough pursuant to the Local Bond Law (Chapter 2 of Title 40A of the New Jersey Statutes Annotated, as amended; the "Local Bond Law"), and (3) the estimated cost of said purpose authorized by the Prior Ordinance is \$740,000, including the sum of \$510,000 appropriated by the Prior Ordinance and

Section 9. The Borough intends to issue bonds or notes to finance the cost of the improvement authorized by the Prior Ordinance and described herein. If the Borough incurs such costs prior to the issuance of such bonds or notes, the Borough hereby states its reasonable expectation to reimburse itself for such expenditures with the proceeds of such bonds or notes in the maximum principal amount of bonds or notes authorized by this ordinance.

Section 10. The full faith and credit of the Borough are hereby pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and the interest on the obligations authorized by this ordinance.
